PREGAME SPECIAL

- ▶ St. Louis CITY SC will be looking for their first win against Seattle after falling in the three previous matches between the two sides.
- ▶ Seattle is the only opponent St. Louis has faced more than once without ever earning at least a point.
- ▶ **Nökkvi Þórissón** again etched his name on the scoresheet in the defeat to Vancouver in the last match.
- ▶ The goal marked his second of the season. Per Opta, Þórissón's goal was CITY SC's 12th goal off a set piece this season (including penalties).
- ▶ Only four MLS teams have scored more set-piece goals this season.
- ▶ In the previous match against Seattle this season, defender **Tomas Totland** scored CITY SC's lone goal off a feed from midfielder

Eduard Löwen.

- ▶ Löwen has recorded 25 goal contributions in 36 starts since joining the league. In 19 road matches, Löwen has scored two goals and recorded five assists.
- ▶ So far this year, 12 different players have provided an assist, 15 players have found the back of the net and 27 players have made an appearance so far in the regular season.

AGAINST SEATTLE

- ▶ The match will be the fourth meeting between the two sides. The Sounders have won all three of their matches against St. Louis CITY SC, including a 2-1 road win on May 25.
- ▶ St. Louis CITY SC will be looking for their first win against Seattle after falling in the three previous matches between the two sides. Seattle is the only opponent St. Louis has faced more than once without ever earning at least a point.
- ▶ CITY SC will come up against a familiar face in Jon Bell when the team takes on Seattle. Bell, a member of the club's inaugural team, played nine matches in total during his time with CITY SC and CITY2. Bell has made five appearances for The Sounders since signing with the team.
- ▶ Another key storyline will be the battle in goals between the two Swiss stoppers Roman Bürki and Stefan Frei.

HACKWORTH: INTERIM HEAD COACH

- ▷ Technical Director **John Hackworth** started managing the team on an interim basis on July 1.
- ▷ A long-time member of the U.S. soccer ecosystem, Hackworth has close to 30 years of coaching experience at various levels, including head coaching positions with the Philadelphia Union and the USL's Louisville City FC, where he led the team to the 2018 USL championship.
- ▷ During his time as head coach at the Union, Hackworth posted a **23-30-20 record** in regular season play. Across four seasons with Louisville City, Hackworth posted a **48-16-14 record**, outscoring his opponents by 149-77 during that span.
- ▷ Hackworth's role as technical director includes supporting sporting director Lutz Pfannenstiel in implementing and managing the team's coaching development programs and working closely with the coaches to ensure that the club's sporting philosophy is consistent at all levels.
- ▷ Hackworth's CITY2 earned the MLS NEXT Pro regular season title in 2022 with a 15-6-3 record which was good for second overall in MLS NEXT Pro.
- ▷ CITY2 tallied the second most wins in the league (15), tied for second most points (49), had the most road wins (8), third most goals for (51), seventh least goals allowed (34), tied for third best goal differential (17), tied for sixth most clean sheets (7), while seeing 16 different goal scorers and 13 assist providers.
- ▷ Hackworth began his CITY SC tenure on a positive note, defeating San Jose Earthquakes 2-0 in his first-ever match in charge for the team.

MLS ALL-STAR

- ▷ St. Louis CITY SC goalkeeper **Roman Bürki** was selected to the 2024 MLS All-Star Game presented by Target. Bürki achieved his second consecutive all-star selection as one of 16 coach's selections, making CITY SC one of 18 MLS teams represented at the all-star game.
- ▷ The 2024 MLS All-Star Game presented by Target will be played on Wednesday, July 24, and features the MLS All-Stars taking on the best of LIGA MX at Lower.com Field.
- ▷ In conjunction with LIGA MX, the MLS All-Star roster was expanded to 30 players in 2024 to provide additional depth. The roster was selected through a combination of fan, player, and media voting (12 players), designations by MLS All-Star head coach Wilfried Nancy of the host club, the Columbus Crew (16 players), and a pair of selections by MLS Commissioner Don Garber.
- ▷ Bürki has played in 21 matches, made 57 saves and has earned six clean sheets so far this season.

SHARING THE LOVE

- ▷ St. Louis CITY SC Sporting Director **Lutz Pfannenstiel** dubbed his roster building strategy with the mantra of "Designated Team".
- ▷ The St. Louis organization has seen many contributions from different players even at the MLS NEXT Pro level.
- ▷ In CITY2's inaugural campaign in 2022, 16 players scored a goal, 13 provided an assist and 30 players, including seven academy prospects, made an appearance.
- ▷ Similarly, in the team's inaugural MLS season, St. Louis had 16 different goal scorers in MLS, 28 players make an appearance, and 24 different players make a start.
- ▷ So far this year, **12 different players** have provided an assist, **15 players** have found the back of the net and **27 players** have made an appearance so far in the regular season.
- ▷ St. Louis has six players with multiple goals this season: **Klauss (5), Célio Pompeu (3), Eduard Löwen (3), Tomas Totland (2), Indiana Vassilev (2), Thórisson (2) and Samuel Adeniran (2)**.
- ▷ Ten players have at least two assists for CITY SC: **Indiana Vassilev (4), Eduard Löwen (3), Pompeu (3), Klauss (3), Totland (2), Chris Durkin (3), Tomáš Ostrák (2), Hosei Kijima (2), Jay Reid (2) and Rasmus Alm (2)**.

CITY2 CONNECTION

- ▷ St. Louis CITY2, the development team for St. Louis CITY SC has seen different successes since its first season in 2022.

- ▷ In its inaugural MLS NEXT Pro campaign, the team wasted no time filling the trophy case, winning the Western Conference regular-season and Western Conference tournament championships.
- ▷ From that inaugural team, five players were promoted to the first team for the 2023 season: **Kyle Hiebert, Josh Yaro, Célio Pompeu, Akil Watts and Michael Creek** (now with FC Tulsa).
- ▷ Both Pompeu and Hiebert have gone on to signing long term contracts with the club, keeping them in St. Louis for the near future.
- ▷ Last season, CITY SC MLS SuperDraft pick **John Klein** who was signed to a CITY2 contract, was called up by head coach Bradley Carnell to make his first team debut against Sporting KC on May 20, 2023.
- ▷ This season, current CITY2 captain **Michael Wentzel** was also called up after spending preseason training with the first team. Wentzel made his first team debut in the team's Concacaf Champions Cup away match against Houston Dynamo on February 27, 2023.
- ▷ Leading up to the match against Colorado Rapids on June 19, St. Louis signed four CITY2 players to short-term loan agreements deal making them eligible for the match.
- ▷ **John Klein, Brendan McSorley, Tyson Pearce and Michael Wentzel** were called up. Brendan McSorley made his MLS first team debut while John Klein made his second appearance of the season.
- ▷ Against Atlanta United, **Jayden Reid** made his first MLS start and Wentzel made his MLS debut for CITY SC.
- ▷ **Klein, Reid and Wentzel** were signed to first team contracts for the remainder of the 2024 MLS season.
- ▷ A total of **23 players** have now played minutes for both CITY2 and St. Louis CITY SC at some point in their stint in St. Louis.

CITYPARK: GATEWAY TO HELL

- ▷ CITYPARK was a tough place for away teams to play at in St. Louis' inaugural season. Last season, St. Louis CITY SC's played in front of a sellout crowd in **all their 17 MLS regular-season home games**.
- ▷ St. Louis has sold out all **29 home games** since joining MLS in 2023.
- ▷ St. Louis kicked off their 2024 season with a 2-1 win at home in the CONCACAF Champions Cup against Houston Dynamo.
- ▷ St. Louis CITY SC has a **15-8-7 record** at CITYPARK and has scored multiple goals in each of their 15 wins and tallied at least three goals in 10 of those matches.
- ▷ This season, St. Louis has a **4-4-5 record** at home with 14 goals scored, 16 goals conceded and five clean sheets.
- ▷ **Klauss** leads the team in all-time goals at CITYPARK with **eight**, while **Eduard Löwen** leads the team in all-time assists with **12**.

CITY SC No. 10

- ▷ St. Louis CITY SC's number 10 **Eduard Löwen**, has played pivotal role in the team's success since signing as a Designated Player ahead of the inaugural season in 2023.
- ▷ In his first MLS season, Löwen took the league by storm, **making 29 appearances (25 starts), scoring six goals and leading the team in assists with 14**, which was tied for third in the league.
- ▷ Given his impressive play in CITY SC's historic, record-breaking inaugural season, Löwen was a finalist for the MLS Newcomer of the Year award.
- ▷ At CITYPARK, **Löwen has recorded 19 goal contributions (seven goals and 12 assists) in 23 regular season matches**.
- ▷ Since the 2023 season, St. Louis is **15-2-2 when Löwen scores or assists** in regular season matches. Löwen has **three goal and three assists** so far this season.

BÜRKI: THE SWISS WALL

- ▷ Last season, **Roman Bürki** was announced as the winner of Allstate MLS Goalkeeper of the Year topping FC Cincinnati's Roman Celentano and Orlando City's Pedro Gallese. The Swiss goalie owned the league's top mark with plus-9.1 Post-Shot Expected Goals minus Goals Allowed and finished second in MLS in saves with 123.
- ▷ CITY SC's captain made 36 appearances, recorded eight (8) clean sheets and made 134 total saves across all competitions.
- ▷ His 17 wins were the most by any goalkeeper during their first MLS season (post-shootout era) and the 42 goals he conceded in MLS play are the fewest of any goalkeeper to play at least 30 games for an



- expansion club in a 34-game season.
- His **123 saves** in MLS play were the second-most among all goalkeepers in MLS and his save percentage (74.55%) in MLS play was the fourth highest among active MLS goalkeepers to play in at least 20 games.
- Per OPTA, Bürki led MLS in goals prevented (11.9), which is the difference between the number of expected goals conceded (based on the quality of shots faced) and actual goals conceded.
- Bürki recorded his **150th career clean sheet** in a 1-0 win against Toronto FC on July 8, 2023 and made a career-high 12 saves in a 1-1 draw against Colorado Rapids on April 22
- Bürki was selected as an All-Star and eventually selected into the 2023 MLS Best XI.
- So far this season Bürki has recorded **six clean sheets** and made **62 saves**.

FIRST 50 MLS MATCHES

- St. Louis kicked off its 2023 inaugural campaign in historic fashion, going 5-0-0 to start the season, a feat that was never been accomplished by an expansion team in MLS history.
- CITY SC finished the 2023 season first in the MLS Western Conference with 56 points and a record of 17-12-5.
- St. Louis CITY SC played their 50th MLS regular season match against Portland Timbers on June 8, 2023
- The match ended in a draw which meant CITY SC (74) accumulated the fifth most points of any MLS team in their first 50 games, trailing only LAFC (94), Atlanta United (88), Houston Dynamo (79) and Seattle Sounders (75).
- CITY SC's 20 all-time wins are tied with Seattle Sounders FC for the fifth-most wins through 50 games in MLS history
- Indiana Vassilev** made CITY SC history as he was the only player to appear in all 50 MLS regular season matches.

TIM PARKER STRIKES FIRST

- For the second consecutive year, CITY SC defender Tim Parker opened the team's scoring account, heading in a cross off a free kick in the club's debut CONCACAF Champions Cup match against Houston Dynamo.
- During the 2023 MLS season, Parker scored the first goal in CITY SC's historic come-from-behind win in the team's inaugural match against Austin FC last season.
- Tim Parker has scored the first MLS, MLS Playoffs and Concacaf Champions Cup goals in CITY SC history.
- The 2023 MLS All-Star now has six goals across all competitions in two seasons with CITY SC.

LÖWEN OPENING DAY ASSISTS

- After setting up Sam Adeniran's game-tying goal in the 79th minute against Real Salt Lake, midfielder **Eduard Löwen** picked up his first assist of the 2024 season.
- With his assist, Löwen provided in CITY SC's MLS opener for the second consecutive season.
- On both occasions, the assist set up the

team's first goal in MLS play, as Löwen fed Tim Parker for the first-ever goal in team history against Austin FC in 2023.

NO WAY, HOSEI!

- Selected 17th overall by CITY SC in the 2024 MLS SuperDraft, midfielder Hosei Kijima made a debut for the ages in CITY SC's 2-1 victory over the Houston Dynamo.
- With his signing officially announced earlier in the match day, Kijima suited up for CITY SC and subbed into the match in the 86th minute, delivering a perfectly placed strike past a diving goalkeeper just five minutes after subbing on to lift the team to a 2-1 victory.
- Kijima is now the second MLS SuperDraft pick to make his debut for CITY SC, following John Klein who made his debut last season
- Kijima is also the 18th different player to score a goal in all competitions for CITY SC in the team's young history
- Kijima is the first MLS SuperDraft pick to score a goal for CITY SC in team history

INAUGURAL SEASON FOR THE HISTORY BOOKS

- St. Louis CITY SC enjoyed one of most successful seasons by an expansion team in both MLS history and across all five major men's sports leagues in the United States — not only defying expectations but breaking numerous expansion team records.
- The team kicked off the MLS season like no other expansion side in the league's history, reeling off a record-setting five victories in their first five matches.
- St. Louis CITY SC finished the regular season 17-12-5, with the team's 56 points good for the second most by an expansion team in MLS history (excluding the shootout era)
- CITY SC's 17 wins set the record for the most wins by an expansion team in MLS history.
- The team became the first expansion team in MLS history to win their conference in their inaugural season, and the second expansion team to qualify for the CONCACAF Champions Cup in their first year.

- Sixteen (16) different players got on the scoresheet for CITY SC in MLS play, tying the team with Charlotte FC (2022) for the most different goal scorers for an expansion team in MLS history.
- CITY SC became the fastest expansion team in MLS history to 50 goals after, reaching the feat in 25 games.
- CITYPARK served as a fortress for the team, as CITY SC's 11 home wins tied Atlanta United FC for the most home wins by an expansion team in MLS history (excluding

CONCACAF CHAMPIONS CUP DEBUT

- ▷ As a byproduct of St. Louis CITY SC's record-setting expansion year in which the team earned 56 points to finish the regular season atop the MLS Western Conference, CITY SC clinched a berth in the 2024 Concacaf Champions Cup, the preeminent soccer competition across North America.
- ▷ Facing Houston Dynamo FC in the First Round of the tournament, CITY SC pulled off a memorable 2-1 victory in the first leg of the teams' two-leg matchup, with goals from vice-captain **Tim Parker** and midfielder **Hosei Kijima**.
- ▷ Parker broke the scoreless deadlock with a header in the 61st minute, scoring his sixth goal with CITY SC across all competitions over the past two seasons
- ▷ Parker now holds the title of having scored the first MLS, MLS Cup Playoffs and Concacaf Champions Cup goals in CITY SC history
- ▷ With Houston poised to steal a result on the road after having equalized in the 72nd minute, Kijima came on as a substitute in the dying moments of the game and had a debut for the ages, as CITY SC's 2024 MLS SuperDraft first round selection worked around a Dynamo defender to score the game-winning goal in stoppage time
- ▷ A week later, the teams played the second leg of the First Round matchup in Houston, in which the Dynamo eked out a 1-0 win and secure their spot in the next round of the tournament after winning the tiebreaker of away goals scored

STARS AND STRIPES REUNITE

- ▷ St. Louis fans are no strangers when it comes to seeing their players featuring for the US Men's National Team. For CITY SC, there are current players and former youth players and staff that have cross paths while representing the Stars and Stripes.
- ▷ **Aziel Jackson** was the latest CITY SC player to feature for the USMNT after making his debut on January 20, 2024 against Slovenia.
- ▷ Prior to Aziel's callup, **Indiana Vassilev** played for the U.S. Men's Olympic Team against Japan U-23 national team last October.
- ▷ Vassilev was also a member of the U-17 national team that featured current teammates **Akil Watts** and **Chris Durkin** and was coached by CITY SC's Technical Director **John Hackworth**.
- ▷ Hackworth, Vassilev, Durkin and Watts helped lead the Under-17 squad to a U-17 World Cup quarterfinal appearance.

O CAP, MY CAP (& VICE)

- ▷ Ahead of last season, goalkeeper **Roman Bürki** as the team's first captain and MLS veteran **Tim Parker** the team's vice captain to serve alongside Bürki.
- ▷ Both Bürki and Parker enjoyed a successful first season with the club, with the duo finishing at the top of the team charts for games started (Bürki – 33, Parker – 29).
- ▷ In August 2023, Bürki and Parker were

named MLS All-Stars, becoming the club's first all-stars for the first team.

- ▷ The pair also received post-season honors, with both earning a spot on the 2023 MLS Best XI.
- ▷ On October 26, 2023, Parker was named as a finalist for the MLS Defender of the Year award and Bürki for MLS Goalkeeper of the Year award. Bürki was voted as number in his category while Parker finished second behind FC Cincinnati's Matt Miazga.

CITYPARK and its surrounding stadium district is the largest urban professional sports campus in the U.S. and the only one with a stadium, team headquarters, and practice facility all within the same footprint. The 31 acre urban campus in Downtown West will help unite the region around its love of sports and serve as the heartbeat of St. Louis by creating a 24/7/365 fan and community experience that encourages visitors and development to Downtown St. Louis.

MLS Commissioner Don Garber said that this comprehensive stadium plan will "serve as a model for future professional sports teams in the U.S."

Anchored by a compact stadium that fits comfortably into its urban neighborhood, the district include spaces for hosting year-round community events, concerts, festivals and other outdoor activities. As a part of the stadium district design vision, every side of the stadium – North, East, South, West – will be open and inclusive and have no back door, with all back of house services occurring via a tunnel below Market Street and fans welcome from every side.

The 100% local STLMade food experience at CITYPARK, designed by James Beard award-winning Chef Gerard Craft, brings to life the next generation of in-stadium convenience, with state-of-the-art "connected stadium" technologies and modern design features including: dedicated mobile-order ahead via the CITY mobile app, frictionless CITY Go walkout markets, self-service kiosks and mobile wallet/pay technologies to decrease transaction times and increase overall fan convenience.

CITYPARK's state-of-the-art Wi-Fi and communications technology are layered on top of the physical stadium, creating an exceptional fan experience that includes local music curated by Musical Director Mvstermind. CITY SC worked with fans and members of the local community to develop everything from partner restaurants to the "music of St. Louis" setting the mood for a truly St. Louis experience.

The first majority female-owned club in MLS history is anchored in the STLMade movement, with a vision to be more than a soccer team and working to be something transformational for the St. Louis region. CITYPARK is our home.
