### MATCH NOTES

• Seattle Sounders FC hosts Real Salt Lake on Saturday, October 11 on the Emerald Queen Casino Pitch at Lumen Field (6:30 p.m. PT / Apple TV, 950 KJR AM, El Rey 1360 AM).

• Seattle is revealing a banner commemorating its Leagues Cup 2025 championship before the match as part of its annual Fan Appreciation Match.

• Seattle currently sits in fifth place in the Western Conference with 49 points (13-9-10), most recently coming off a 1-0 home win over Portland on October 4. RSL is in ninth place in the West with 40 points (12-16-4), most recently defeating the Colorado Rapids 1-0 at home, also on October 4.

• Seattle and Real Salt Lake met earlier this year on March 1 at America First Field, a 2-0 win for the Utah side. The Rave Green have a 12-4-3 record against Real Salt Lake at home in the regular season.

• Seattle has already clinched a spot in the Audi 2025 MLS Cup Playoffs and is guaranteed to finish either fifth or sixth in the Western Conference. It is the 16th playoff appearance for Seattle in its 17 years of existence, the most of any expansion team in league history.

• Sounders FC midfielder Obed Vargas was voted number one on the 2025 MLS 22 Under 22 rankings, an annual list of the top young talent across the league. Vargas finished seventh in last year's edition of the list.

• Cristian Roldan (USA), Nouhou (Cameroon), Georgi Minoungou (Burkina Faso) and Snyder Brunell (USA U-19), are all currently on international duty for their respective countries and will miss Saturday's match against Real Salt Lake.

• Additionally, Reed Baker-Whiting (USA) and Vargas (Mexico) are currently participating in the 2025 FIFA U-20 World Cup taking place in Chile from September 27 - October 20. Both teams advanced to the Quarterfinals with wins in the Round of 16.

• Following Saturday's match, the Rave Green hit the road for their final road match of the season in a Decision Day fixture against New York City FC on Saturday, October 18 at Citi Field (3:00 p.m. PT / Apple TV, iHeartMedia Seattle, El Rey 1360 AM) before beginning its Audi 2025 MLS Cup Playoffs run.

## VARGAS NAMED NO. 1 ON 22 UNDER 22 LIST



Major League Soccer announced on October 8 its 2025 22 Under 22 list, with Sounders FC midfielder Obed Vargas named to the top spot for the first time in his career. Voted on by a panel of MLS staff, MLS Season Pass talent and club technical staff, the list honors the top young talent across all of MLS under the age of 22. Previously known as the 24 Under 24 list until 2018, Vargas joins Fredy Montero (2010) and DeAndre Yedlin (2014) as the only Sounders players to take home the top spot in the annual ranking.

"We couldn't be prouder of Obed and the recognition he's earned as the top young player in Major League Soccer," said Sounders FC General Manager & Chief Soccer Officer Craig Waibel. "From the moment he joined our club, his maturity, work ethic and competitiveness have set him apart. Obed remains grounded and committed to getting better every day. This honor is a reflection not just of his individual talent, but of the collective effort of our coaches, teammates and development staff who've helped him grow within the Sounders system."

Vargas, 20, jumped six spots in the rankings this year after coming in at number seven on the 2024 22 Under 22 list. The midfielder has made 38 appearances for the club in all competitions, recording four goals and seven assists. He started all three of the Rave Green's three fixtures during the 2025 FIFA Club World Cup and played every minute of the club's championship run at Leagues Cup 2025, helping claim the franchise's ninth major trophy.

In 2025 MLS regular-season play, Vargas has started all 26 of his appearances with three goals and five assists. He ranks second on the team in minutes (2,273), third in completed passes (1,171) and seventh in pass percentage (89%), earning his first MLS All-Star nod earlier this year. Since signing with Sounders FC prior to the 2022 season at the age of 16, Vargas has made 127 appearances (105 starts), recording six goals and 11 assists in all competitions.

"Obed has earned this recognition through hard work and consistency from the moment he joined the club," said Sounders FC Head Coach Brian Schmetzer. "He's taken every opportunity to learn and improve, and he continues to be an important part of our group. We're proud of the progress he's made, and this is a well-deserved acknowledgment of his growth as a player."

Vargas has also made an impact on the international stage, currently in Chile representing the Mexico U-20 Men's National Team at the 2025 FIFA U-20 World Cup. He has started all of Mexico's matches in the tournament so far, helping El Tri finish second in Group C. Mexico advanced to the Quarterfinals yesterday with a 4-1 win over Chile and will face Argentina on October 11. The midfielder earned his first cap with the Mexican senior team in October 2024 with a substitute appearance against the United States in a 2-0 victory. He was also called into Mexico's U-23 squad during the September 2024 window for a training camp and friendlies. Vargas also made nine appearances for the U.S. Youth Men's National Team at various levels before utilizing his one-time federation switch to Mexico.

The Anchorage, Alaska native joined Sounders FC Academy at the age of 14 from Cook Inlet Soccer Club, going on to play one season with Tacoma Defiance in 2021. While still with Defiance, he started and played 77 minutes in Seattle's victory over Austin FC on July 22, 2021, at the time the third-youngest player in league history to play in a match (15 years and 351 days) before signing with the club following the season.

## SEATTLE WINS LEAGUES CUP 2025



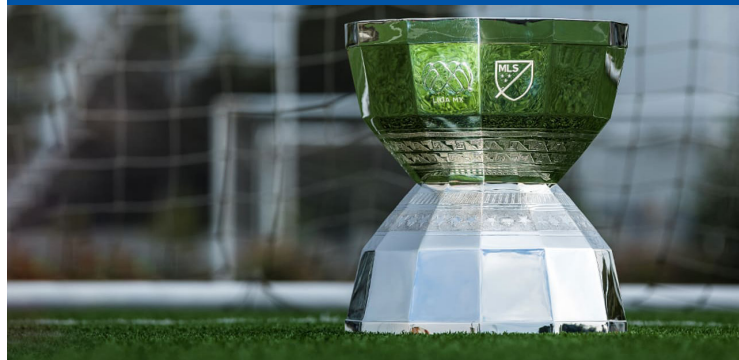
Seattle Sounders FC captured the Leagues Cup 2025 trophy on August 31 with a 3-0 win over Inter Miami CF, the first Leagues Cup title in club history. The title capped off a dominant run for the Rave Green throughout the tournament, compiling a 5-0-1 record and outscoring their opponents by 14 goals (16 goals for, two against).

Sounders FC cruised through Phase One play, becoming the only team in the tournament, MLS or Liga MX, to win all three of its matches, including a dominant 7-0 victory over Cruz Azul. The club then defeated Club Puebla in a shootout following a 0-0 draw in the Quarterfinals, setting up a Semifinals matchup against the LA Galaxy at Dignity Health Sports Park, which Seattle won 2-0 behind goals from Pedro de la Vega and Osaze De Rosario.

Seattle then hosted the final against Miami in front of a Leagues Cup and club-record single-match crowd of 69,314 at Lumen Field. De Rosario scored in the first half, with Alex Roldan bagging a penalty in the second half and Paul Rothrock adding the exclamation point, as goalkeeper Andrew Thomas kept the clean sheet to win 3-0.

Three members of the Rave Green won individual awards: Pedro de la Vega won Player of the Tournament, Andrew Thomas won Goalkeeper of the Tournament and Alex Roldan won Most Valuable Player for the Final.

By winning Leagues Cup 2025, Seattle became the first soccer team in North America to win all five major trophies available to them - MLS Cup, Supporters' Shield, Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, Concacaf Champions Cup and one Leagues Cup.

Since joining MLS in 2009, Seattle's nine trophies - four U.S. Open Cups, two MLS Cups, one Supporters' Shield, one Concacaf Champions Cup and one Leagues Cup - are the most among any team in MLS since 2009, and are three more than the next-closest team, the LA Galaxy.

August 31 marked Seattle's 13th final since joining MLS. The club holds a 8-3-2 record in those contests. It was also the fifth final that Seattle has played at home, boasting a perfect 5-0-0 record and tied the largest margin of victory ever in a final (3-0 win against Pumas UNAM in 2022 Concacaf Champions Cup Final).

Head Coach Brian Schmetzer has been at the helm for four of Seattle's nine titles (2016 and 2019 MLS Cups, 2022 Concacaf Champions Cup and 2025 Leagues Cup) and has reached eight different finals.

## DOMINANCE AT LUMEN FIELD



The Rave Green have only lost once at Lumen Field in MLS play this year, compiling a 9-1-6 record with one home match left to play. 2025 Supporters' Shield-winning Philadelphia Union are the only other team in MLS with one loss at home this year.

Should the club get a result against Real Salt Lake on Saturday, it would tie 2017 and 2020 as the only seasons with one home loss in the regular season, reaching the MLS Cup Final in the previous two campaigns.

Seattle has a 68.77% home winning percentage in the regular season since it joined the leagues in 2009, third among all teams in MLS history (including the now-defunct Chivas USA, Miami Fusion and Tampa Bay Mutiny). That number trails only LAFC (74.03%) and NYCFC (69.38%), though the Rave Green have played nearly 100 more home matches than either team.

## TWO SOUNDERS PLAYING IN U-20 WC



Reed Baker-Whiting and Obed Vargas have been named to the final rosters for the United States and Mexico, respectively, for the 2025 FIFA U-20 World Cup™. The pair of Homegrown Players will represent the Rave Green in the global tournament taking place from September 27 to October 19 in Chile. Both players departed following the match at Austin on September 21.

"Having both Reed and Obed called up to represent their country at the U-20 World Cup is a proud moment for our entire organization," said Sounders FC General Manager & Chief Soccer Officer Craig Waibel. "It's a reflection of the work they've put in and the commitment of our development pathway to prepare players for opportunities like this. Competing on the world stage will be a valuable experience for both of them, and we're excited to see how it helps their continued growth as professionals."

Baker-Whiting, 20, has represented the United States at the U-17, U-19 and U-20 levels, most recently being called up for a camp with the U-20s in San Pedro del Pintar, Spain during the September FIFA window. The Seattle native has appeared in 17 matches (nine starts) in all competitions for the Rave Green this year, including a 90-minute shift opposite Lionel Messi in Seattle's 3-0 win over Inter Miami CF in the Leagues Cup 2025 Final on August 31. The Seattle native recently signed a new contract with the club through at least the 2028 season. The Stars and Stripes finished atop Group E and advanced to the Quarterfinals with a 3-0 win over Italy on October 9.

"It's always special when players from our club are called in to play on the biggest stage, and we're proud of both Reed and Obed for earning this opportunity," said Sounders FC Head Coach Brian Schmetzer. "They've each put in a lot of hard work in training and have shown the commitment it takes to grow at this level. Competing at the U-20 World Cup will only improve their abilities, and we're looking forward to seeing how it helps the club when they return."

Vargas, 20, also was called-up during the September FIFA window for a camp with the Mexico U-20s. The midfielder earned his first cap with the Mexico senior team in October 2024 with a substitute appearance against the United States in a 2-0 victory. He was also called into Mexico's U-23 squad during the September 2024 window for a training camp and pair of friendlies. Vargas has started all 37 of his appearances in all competitions this year, scoring four goals and adding seven assists. El Tri is set to face Argentina after finishing second in Group C and defeating Chile 4-1 in the Round of 16.

Additionally, Tacoma Defiance interim Head Coach Mike Morris is serving as an Assistant Coach for the U.S. U-20 Men's Youth National Team during the tournament. Morris has been with Sounders FC since the club formed in 2009 and has been a longtime integral member of the club's development programs. The Washington native took over sideline duties for Defiance after the club parted ways with Hervé Diez earlier this season.

## INTERNATIONAL SOUNDERS



In addition to Reed Baker-Whiting and Obed Vargas playing in the FIFA U-20 World Cup, Cristian Roldan (USA), Nouhou (Cameroon), Georgi Minoungou (Burkina Faso) and Snyder Brunell (USA U-19) have all been called up to their respective national teams during the October FIFA window.

Roldan, 30, has 39 career international caps and was part of the USMNT squad at the 2022 FIFA World Cup Qatar. He most recently appeared for the Stars and Stripes last month in a pair of friendlies, putting in a full 90-minute shift in a 2-0 win over Japan. He also played in all five of the USMNT's fixtures in the 2023 Concacaf Gold Cup and recorded an assist in a 6-0 win over Saint Kitts and Nevis. Pochettino's squad is set to face two 2026 FIFA World Cup-bound opponents in the upcoming window, beginning with Ecuador on October 10 at Q2 Stadium in Austin, Texas (5:30 p.m. PT / TNT, TruTV, HBO Max, Universo, Peacock) before a matchup with Australia on October 14 at Dick's Sporting Goods Park in Commerce City, Colorado (6:00 p.m. PT / TNT, HBO Max, Universo, Peacock). Roldan has 42 appearances (39 starts) for Seattle this season in all competitions, scoring two goals and recording a team-high 11 assists. Since being selected by Seattle in the First Round of the 2015 MLS SuperDraft, Roldan ranks second in club history with 388 appearances across all competitions, sixth with 44 goals and second with 68 assists.

Nouhou, 27, has 40 career international caps since making his international debut for Cameroon in 2017. He played every minute in Les Lions Indomptables' three Group Stage matches at the 2022 FIFA World Cup™, including the country's historic 1-0 win over Brazil. The defender was most recently called up in September for a pair of World Cup Qualifiers, logging 90 minutes against Cape Verde. Cameroon, who currently sits in second place in CAF Group D with 18 points (5-1-3), defeated Mauritius 2-0 on October 8 and plays Angola on October 13 (9:00 a.m. PT / ESPN+). Nouhou has 36 appearances (33 starts) in all competitions for Sounders FC this year, scoring two goals.

Minoungou, 23, earns his second career international callup after joining Burkina Faso last month for a pair of World Cup Qualifiers. Les Etalons defeated Sierra Leone 1-0 on October 8 and face Ethiopia on October 12 (12:00 p.m. PT / ESPN+). Burkina Faso currently sits in second place in the CAF Group A standings with 18 points (5-1-3). Minoungou has 29 appearances (seven starts) in all competitions for Seattle this year, recording two goals and four assists.

Brunell, 18, joins the U.S. U-19 Men's Youth National Team for a camp in Marbella, Spain with friendlies scheduled against Northern Ireland and Belgium. The midfielder previously joined the U-19s last month for its Domestic Identity Camp in Georgia. Brunell also played for the U-18 MYNT in the UEFA Friendship Cup in Nyon, Switzerland, winning the title with a shootout win over Portugal. Brunell signed with Seattle in July and has scored two goals in seven appearances (three starts) for the club in all competitions.

## SOUNDERS FC TO HONOR FANS AND DROP LEAGUES CUP 2025 BANNER ON SATURDAY



As Sounders FC prepares to host Real Salt Lake in its regular-season home finale on Saturday, October 11 on the Emerald Queen Casino Pitch at Lumen Field (6:30 p.m. PT / Apple TV, 950 KJR AM, El Rey 1360 AM), fans are encouraged to arrive early and enjoy a heavy slate of matchday activities surrounding the Rave Green's annual Fan Appreciation Match, presented by matchday sponsor Providence. In addition to celebrating the Sounders FC faithful for their season-long support, the club is unveiling its Leagues Cup 2025 championship banner in the Lumen Field rafters prior to kickoff. Those in attendance are strongly encouraged to be in their seats by 6:20 p.m. PT to see the banner drop during a special pre-match ceremony.

On August 31, the Rave Green defeated Lionel Messi and Inter Miami CF 3-0 in the Leagues Cup 2025 Final in front of record crowd of 69,314 fans, the highest-attended Sounders FC home match in club history. Sounders FC now has a total of nine major trophies in its cabinet since joining the league in 2009, three more than any other MLS club in that span.

Saturday's match brings the club and its supporters together to celebrate a historic moment in American soccer, with fans in attendance able to witness the Leagues Cup title immortalized among the club's other achievements in the stadium's rafters.

Sounders FC celebrates its loyal supporters this Saturday with the annual Fan Appreciation Match, presented by matchday sponsor Providence. Throughout the match, the Rave Green honor the unique bond between the club and its fans, recognizing their impact for going above and beyond the role of spectators. Matchday includes a special pre-match presentation to thank fans, along with a wide variety of special activities and giveaways throughout the evening.

Throughout the stadium, fans have a chance to get one additional token by participating in each of the club's gameday activations including the Providence Challenge, Crossbar Challenge, Soccer Skee-ball, Target Kick, as well as AmFam and Sparkling Ice Poster Making.

In Alliance Member Central, former Sounders and Brand Ambassadors Brad Evans and Steve Zakuani are broadcasting live from 5:30 – 6:15 p.m. PT. Saturday's national anthem is being performed by matchday staple Johnathan Wright, while the "Scarves Up!" moment is led by 2025 Sounders FC "Fan of the Year."

At the conclusion of the match, Sounders FC players will thank fans for their support by handing out carnations – the club's symbol of the relationship between its players and fans. Seattle Sounders FC, Seattle Reign FC and their charitable partner RAVE Foundation announced on September 12 the clubs' plans to commemorate Latine Heritage Month – an annual recognition that celebrates the diversity of culture and heritage within the Latine community.

As the Rave Green kick off Latine Heritage Month – which runs from September 15 to October 15 each year – the club recognizes the complexity of the language used. As clubs, Sounders and Reign are committed to supporting individuals of all backgrounds and have chosen to use the term "Latine" to foster the most inclusive environment for all. By using this gender-inclusive language, the clubs reaffirm their commitments to advancing equity, supporting those who do not identify within the gender binary and acknowledging the intersectional identities held by the Seattle soccer community. The clubs have updated their language from the previously used "Latinx", a community-informed decision that follows conventions of romance languages, such as Spanish and Portuguese. This year, Sounders FC is teaming up with the Consulate of Mexico in Seattle, Sea Mar Community Health Centers, KEXP and Intentionalist to provide a handful of activities in recognition to the Latine community, with a full list of this year's events and matchday activations available below.

Sounders FC is taking part in this year's Sea Mar Fiestas Patrias Parade, marching proudly while engaging with community members and giving away Sounders FC-branded items. The parade, a celebration of the community and all that it has to offer, will take place on Saturday, September 13 from 10:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. PT at Sea Mar Community Health Centers Administration (1040 South Henderson Street, Seattle, WA 98108).
