### MATCH NOTES

- Seattle Sounders FC faces Houston Dynamo FC on Saturday, March 22 on the Emerald Queen Casino Pitch at Lumen Field (7:30 p.m. PT / Apple TV, iHeartMedia Seattle, El Rey 1360 AM).

- The Rave Green are coming off a 1-0 loss to St. Louis CITY SC on March 15, dropping points against the Midwestern side for the first time.

- Sounders FC currently sits in 10th place in the Western Conference with four points. Houston is in 14th place in the West with one point.

- Midfielder Cristian Roldan made his 353rd all-competition appearance for the club on Saturday against St. Louis, passing Zach Scott for the most by a field player of any era in Sounders history.

- Saturday marks the return of club legend Nico Lodeiro. The midfielder played for Seattle from 2016-2023, winning two MLS Cups, four Western Conference championships and the 2022 Concacaf Champions Cup title. He is being honored by the club prior to kickoff.

- Jordan Morris is being recognized at halftime after recently breaking the club's all-time scoring record, while Cristian Roldan is being honored following pregame warmups after passing Zach Scott for the most all-competition appearances by a Sounders field player across all eras.

- The Rave Green have never lost at home to Houston, going 13-0-4 (including playoffs) against the Texas side. Seattle has also only been shutout against Houston once in the regular season.

- Nouhou and Obed Vargas were called into international duty this week. Nouhou joins Cameroon for FIFA World Cup 2026 qualifying matches, while Vargas joins the Mexico U-20s for a camp and friendlies in Spain.

- Following Saturday's matchup, Seattle travels to the San Jose Earthquakes on Saturday, March 29 at PayPal Park (7:30 p.m. PT / Apple TV, iHeartMedia Seattle, 1360 KJR AM).

## LODEIRO'S RETURN



Seattle Sounders legend and longtime captain Nico Lodeiro returns to Lumen Field when Houston comes to town on Saturday. Lodeiro played for Seattle from 2016-2023, winning two MLS Cups (2016, 2019), four Western Conference championships (2016, 2017, 2019, 2020) and the 2022 Concacaf Champions Cup title. His 95 all-competition assists rank first in team history, 36 more than the next-closest player. Lodeiro also ranks fourth in all-competition goals (58), eighth in appearances (231) and sixth in starts (211). Following his departure from Seattle, the midfielder played with Orlando in 2024 before signing with Houston prior to the 2025 season.

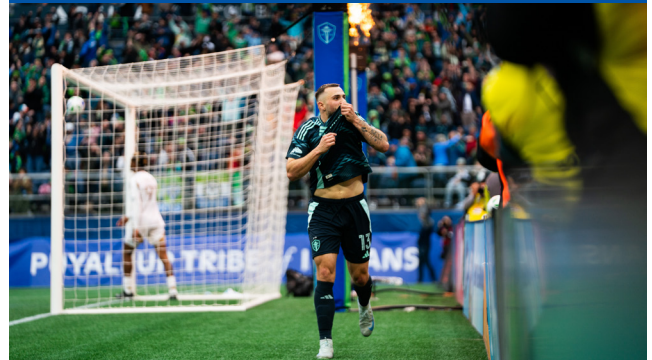

Seattle forward Jordan Morris recorded his 87th all-competition goal against LAFC on March 8, breaking a tie with Raúl Ruidíaz for most in club history. The former Sounders FC Academy player now stands alone at the top of a list of iconic strikers for Sounders FC.

## NOUHOU AND VARGAS CALLED UP



Sounders FC defender Nouhou and midfielder Obed Vargas have been called in to represent their national teams during the March FIFA window. Nouhou is set to join Cameroon for 2026 FIFA World Cup qualifiers, while Vargas reports to the Mexico U-20s for a camp and friendlies in Spain. Additionally, Tacoma Defiance forward Osaze De Rosario and midfielder Snyder Brunell have been called up to Guyana and the U.S. U-18 Men's National Team, respectively.

Nouhou, 27, has 37 career caps for Cameroon since 2018. The Douala native most recently started a pair of matches in November for Les Lions Indomptables during its Africa Cup of Nations 2025 qualifying run. Nouhou notably played every minute in all three of Cameroon's 2022 FIFA World Cup matches, including the country's historic 1-0 win over Brazil. Cameroon continues its 2026 FIFA World Cup qualifying campaign during the March window, playing to a 0-0 draw with Eswatini on March 19 and will face Libya on March 25. Cameroon currently sits in second place in Group D with 9 points (2-3-0). Nouhou has seven appearances for Seattle in 2025 all competitions, including all four of the club's 2025 Concacaf Champions Cup fixtures.

Vargas, 19, gets his second nod with the Mexico U-20s, previously being called up in November for a camp in Mexico City. He earned his first cap with the senior team during the October window, making a substitute appearance against the United States in a 2-0 victory. Vargas also participated in a camp with the Mexico U-23s in September. Prior to representing Mexico, the midfielder represented the United States at the youth levels, including five appearances (three starts) at the 2023 FIFA U-20 World Cup in Argentina. El Tri is holding a camp in Spain and defeated Spanish side Benidorm 3-0 on March 19 and now faces the United States on March 22 and France and March 24. Vargas has appeared in six matches for Sounders FC in all competitions this season, recording three assists, tied for the most on the team.

## TACOMA DEFIANCE UPDATE



Tacoma Defiance defeated The Town FC 3-1 on March 14, earning its first win of the year and MLS NEXT Pro Team of the Matchweek honors. It now faces off against the Washington Athletic Club on Thursday, March 20 in the First Round of the 2025 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup.

## CRISTIAN PASSES ZACH SCOTT



With his appearance against St. Louis on March 15, Sounders FC midfielder Cristian Roldan reached 353 all-competition appearances for the club, passing Zach Scott for the most dating back to 1974 by a field player in any era of Sounders history.

Roldan was drafted by Seattle in the first round of the 2015 MLS SuperDraft and is enjoying his 11th season with the club. The University of Washington product has helped the club win the 2016 and 2019 MLS Cup and the 2022 Concacaf Champions Cup trophy. He has tallied 58 assists in all competitions, second in club history.

Scott, who retired at the end of the 2016 season, played for Seattle for 15 years at both the USL and MLS level. He won seven trophies throughout his time with the team.

## SCHMETZER NEARING TOP 10



Sounders FC Head Coach Brian Schmetzer is currently sitting at 127 regular-season wins since taking over the club midway through the 2016 season. He is three wins shy from entering the top 10 among all coaches in MLS history. Since he was appointed Head Coach, Schmetzer has led Seattle to two MLS Cups, four Western Conference championships and the 2022 Concacaf Champions Cup title.

This one-of-a-kind kit also has purpose beyond the pitch. These funds will be thoughtfully invested to support youth education and arts programs honoring the traditions of Washington State’s tribal communities, advance conservation efforts to restore the health of the Salish Sea and provide meaningful experiences for tribal youth, including educational field trips and opportunities to attend Sounders FC matches.

Through these initiatives, Sounders FC aims to honor the interconnectedness of the region’s people and environment, creating a legacy that uplifts communities and inspires stewardship of the Salish Sea.

Born at the water’s edge in 1974, Sounders FC has been inextricably connected to the Puget Sound from the club’s earliest days. But the waters of the Sound – part of the greater Salish Sea – have a history far deeper and vaster, stretching back through the generations to time immemorial. The Salish Sea flows both literally through its waters and figuratively through its spirit, sustaining life and building strong communities. Sounders FC’s Salish Sea Kit honors water as a life force and a vessel for rich cultural traditions.

The jersey’s striking geometric pattern suggests a sense of dimensionality and flow, inspired by twilling and twining, two traditional Southern Coast Salish weaving techniques. These techniques, passed down through generations, pay respect to the resilience, connection and creativity that define the cultural fabric of the region.

The design draws directly from the artistry of three distinguished indigenous Pacific Northwestern artists Connie McCloud, Gail White Eagle and Danielle Morsette.

Coast Salish artist Louie Gong (Nooksack Tribe) played an instrumental role in bringing this group of collaborators together, recommending that the jersey’s story be told through the work of these three talented women who have now brought their weaving traditions to life on a global stage, constructing The Salish Sea Kit as an authentic and novel testament to Coast Salish tradition.

The phrase “Water Is Sacred” appears on the bottom left corner of each jersey front, proudly printed in both English and Southern Lushootseed, the traditional language of the Puyallup, Muckleshoot, Suquamish and neighboring Coast Salish tribes. This powerful statement underscores the deep cultural and spiritual connection to the Salish Sea and serves as a reminder of the shared responsibility to protect it.

The neck hit features an original design that combines a wave of water, the tail of an orca and a flowing “S” that represents both the Seattle Sounders and the Salish Sea. Anchored by the club’s birth year, 1974, this motif reflects a commitment to stewardship that spans generations – connecting the past, present and future in the fight to preserve our environment.

The right jersey sleeve showcases the logo of the Puyallup Tribe, an original steward of the land throughout what is now known as the Puget Sound. The tribe and its Emerald Queen Casino have partnered with Sounders FC since 2021.

## SOUNDERS FC AND VISSELL KOBE RENEW HISTORIC PARTNERSHIP

Sounders FC and Japanese club Vissel Kobe recently announced a renewal of their historic partnership, a momentous step toward strengthening global connections and celebrating the bond between sister cities Seattle and Kobe. This week marks the 30th anniversary of the two clubs' initial collaboration, and this renewed relationship will continue to foster cultural exchange, community engagement and mutual support between the clubs, their cities and fans. The partnership between the two clubs includes collaborative aspects on the technical side, including player development, scouting and squad management, in addition to marketing, digital and commercial endeavors.

The partnership between Sounders FC and Vissel Kobe was first established in 1995 in response to the devastating Kobe earthquake that affected thousands of lives. In the wake of this tragedy, the two teams united in a show of solidarity, playing two international matches – one in Kobe and one in Seattle – raising awareness and funds for earthquake relief efforts. This landmark initiative not only united two soccer clubs but also formed a lasting friendship between the cities of Seattle and Kobe, which have been sister cities since 1957.

"The bond between our two clubs and cities has always been one of special significance," said Sounders FC Owner Adrian Hanauer, who took the first step toward renewing this cherished relationship by personally reaching out to Vissel Kobe in late 2024. "As we approach the 30th anniversary of our partnership, it felt like the right time to renew our commitment to one another and explore new opportunities for collaboration. This partnership transcends soccer – it's about global community, shared values and mutual respect."

This renewal of the partnership was sparked during Hanauer's visit to Japan in December 2024 to meet with executives from Vissel Kobe (pictured above with Vissel Kobe Vice Chairman Kenichi Mikitani). Both clubs are committed to creating new opportunities for cultural exchange and youth development, with a focus on promoting soccer and strengthening the ties between Seattle and Kobe. Through this renewed collaboration, Sounders FC and Vissel Kobe will explore initiatives that bring their communities together, including friendly matches, youth camps and joint charitable events to support causes that impact both Japan and the Pacific Northwest.

"We are pleased to announce that Vissel Kobe has formed a partnership with Seattle Sounders FC," said Vissel Kobe President Yuki Chifu. "Kobe and Seattle are sister cities, and this partnership has its roots in the events following the Great Hanshin-Awaji Earthquake in 1995. In that year, Vissel Kobe visited Seattle, and the following year, in 1996, the predecessor of Seattle Sounders FC came to Kobe for a charity match. This historical connection has led to the realization of this partnership. It is an honor to collaborate with such an outstanding club as Seattle Sounders FC."






"This partnership will involve efforts on both sports and business fronts," continued Chifu. "Moving forward, we aim to deepen collaboration in various areas, including enhancing player transfers and development, creating growth opportunities for young players and promoting the discovery and nurturing of talented players through scouting and data sharing. Additionally, as a bridge between Asia and America, we are committed to enhancing the brand value of both clubs. We look forward to many years of mutual growth and success for both clubs."

To kick off the renewed partnership, Vissel Kobe has loaned defender Kaito Yamada to Tacoma Defiance for the 2025 campaign. The 18-year-old centerback has spent time with the Japan Youth National Team and now joins Sounders FC's MLS NEXT Pro side for the upcoming season, which begins later this spring.

Sounders FC and Vissel Kobe also plan to enhance their digital engagement and provide fans in both cities with unique opportunities to connect with their teams across borders. The partnership is a celebration of soccer's power to unite people around the world, creating a space for collaboration beyond the pitch. The clubs will continue to focus on mutual growth, helping to raise the profile of the beautiful game in both Japan and the United States.
