MATCH NOTES

• Seattle Sounders continues its three-match road stretch with a visit to 2025 expansion side San Diego FC on Saturday, April 5 at Snapdragon Stadium (7:30 p.m. PT / Apple TV, iHeartMedia Seattle, El Rey 1360 AM).

• The Rave Green are coming off a 1-1 draw with the San Jose Earthquakes on March 29 at PayPal Park, while San Diego FC most recently defeated LAFC 3-2 at Snapdragon Stadium, also on March 29.

• Sounders FC currently sits in 12th place in the Western Conference with six points. San Diego is in third place in the West with 11 points.

• Saturday marks the first matchup between Seattle and San Diego. The Rave Green have a 7-2-4 record in their first match against expansion teams that have joined the league since 2009. The two sides will meet one more time this season on May 28 at Lumen Field.

• Seattle recently announced the signing of winger Ryan Kent. The Oldham, England native has over 300 appearances in all competitions across Europe, including five seasons with Scotland's Rangers.

• Albert Rusnák scored the game-tying goal last week in San Jose, his second of the season to go along with three assists. Rusnák led Seattle with 30 goal contributions in all competitions last season (11 goals and 19 assists). The midfielder is also second in MLS with 23 key passes this season.

• Sounders FC midfielder Paul Arriola underwent successful left knee surgery on March 24 for a torn ACL. He was placed on the Season-Ending Injury List and will miss the remainder of the 2025 season.

• Following Saturday's matchup, Seattle ends its road stretch with a visit to FC Dallas on Saturday, April 12 at Toyota Stadium (5:30 p.m. PT / Apple TV, iHeartMedia Seattle, El Rey 1360 AM).

SEATTLE VS. EXPANSION TEAMS



Seattle has enjoyed great success in its first match against expansion sides since Sounders FC was an expansion team itself in 2009. Beginning with a 2-0 win against the Philadelphia Union in Philly's first match as a MLS franchise in 2010, the Rave Green have amassed a 7-2-4 record in their first match against expansion sides that joined MLS after 2009. Seattle has outscored its opponent 26-11 in those matches, scoring multiple goals eight times and recording six shutouts.

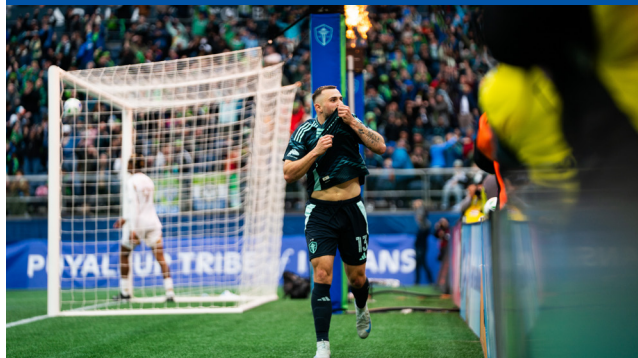

SOUNDERS FC SIGNS RYAN KENT



Sounders FC announced in April 1 that it has signed English winger Ryan Kent for the remainder of the 2025 season, with a club option for 2026. The 28-year-old joins the Rave Green after 10 professional seasons in Europe, Scotland and Turkey. A product of Liverpool's youth system, Kent notably spent five seasons with Rangers FC of the Scottish Premier League, earning Scotland Young Player of the Year in 2018-2019, Scottish Premiership Team of the Year in 2018-2019 and 2020-2021, as well as UEFA Europa League Team of the Season in 2021-2022. The Oldham, England native comes to Seattle following two seasons with Turkish power Fenerbahçe.

"We're thrilled to welcome Ryan Kent to Seattle and add him to our existing group this season," said Sounders FC General Manager & Chief Soccer Officer Craig Waibel. "Ryan is a dynamic winger with top-level experience who brings pace, creativity and a dangerous attacking threat. His versatility and work ethic make him a great fit for our system, and we believe he can make an immediate impact and allow us to continue competing at the highest level."

Kent joins the Rave Green after most recently playing for Turkish power Fenerbahçe from 2023-2024, making 19 appearances across all competitions, including 10 in UEFA Conference League and one in UEFA Champions League play. Prior to his time in Turkey, Kent played for Rangers from 2018-2022 (at first on loan from Liverpool before a permanent transfer in September 2019), scoring 34 goals in 216 appearances across all competitions over five seasons, twice earning Scottish Premiership Team of the Year (2018-2019 & 2020-2021). He was named 2018-2019 Scotland Young Player of the Year in his first season in Glasgow after scoring six goals in 27 league matches. A standout 2020-2021 campaign saw him start 36 of 37 league appearances with 10 goals as Rangers captured the Scottish Premiership title. On top of his accomplishments with Rangers in league play, Kent appeared in 11 UEFA Champions League matches and 43 UEFA Europa League fixtures, earning Europa League Team of the season honors in 2021-2022.

"Ryan is a very good player with an impressive pedigree, and we're excited to bring him into our team," said Sounders FC Head Coach Brian Schmetzer. "He's got real quality on the ball, is effective at taking players on and stretches opposing backlines, which should give us another dimension in the final third. We're confident Ryan will integrate quickly and give us a big lift as we continue a long, grueling 2025 campaign."

After joining Liverpool's academy at the age of seven, Kent made his way up the youth system before going out on loan to Coventry City in 2015-2016. His breakout season came in 2016-2017 while on loan with Barnsley, winning the club's Young Player of the Year award after appearing in 44 English Championship matches, scoring three goals. He later went on loan stints with SC Freiburg and Bristol City before heading to Rangers in 2018. On the international stage, Kent made eight appearances in the youth ranks for England, scoring two goals for the U-18s and one for the U-20s.

CALL IN THE REINFORCEMENTS



The Rave Green's depth has been on full display this season, leading MLS in goal contributions off the bench with eight, doubling the next-closest team (Philadelphia, four). With a mix of veteran and young players available for selection every match, Seattle has had no issues with its substitutes creating impact plays.

SOUNDERS FC UNVEILS THE SALISH SEA KIT



Seattle Sounders FC this season “The Salish Sea Kit,” part of adidas’ Community Kit collection and the club’s new secondary kit for the 2025-2026 Major League Soccer seasons. Featuring cool green and blue tones evoking Pacific Northwestern waters and a unique pattern derived from Coast Salish weaving traditions in collaboration with indigenous artists representing the Puyallup, Muckleshoot and Suquamish Tribes, The Salish Sea Kit serves a call to protect what sustains us and to celebrate the connections that make us whole.

This one-of-a-kind kit also has purpose beyond the pitch. Sounders FC is committed to donating proceeds up to \$50,000 from the first 30 days of The Salish Sea Kit’s sales to organizations dedicated to preserving the cultural heritage of tribal communities and protecting the Salish Sea’s remarkable ecosystem, including: The Burke Museum, Potlatch Fund, Puget Soundkeeper, Seattle Aquarium and RAVE Foundation.

These funds will be thoughtfully invested to support youth education and arts programs honoring the traditions of Washington State’s tribal communities, advance conservation efforts to restore the health of the Salish Sea and provide meaningful experiences for tribal youth, including educational field trips and opportunities to attend Sounders FC matches.

Through these initiatives, Sounders FC aims to honor the interconnectedness of the region’s people and environment, creating a legacy that uplifts communities and inspires stewardship of the Salish Sea.

Born at the water’s edge in 1974, Sounders FC has been inextricably connected to the Puget Sound from the club’s earliest days. But the waters of the Sound – part of the greater Salish Sea – have a history far deeper and vaster, stretching back through the generations to time immemorial. The Salish Sea flows both literally through its waters and figuratively through its spirit, sustaining life and building strong communities. Sounders FC’s Salish Sea Kit honors water as a life force and a vessel for rich cultural traditions.

The jersey’s striking geometric pattern suggests a sense of dimensionality and flow, inspired by twilling and twining, two traditional Southern Coast Salish weaving techniques. These techniques, passed down through generations, pay respect to the resilience, connection and creativity that define the cultural fabric of the region.

The design draws directly from the artistry of three distinguished indigenous Pacific Northwestern artists Connie McCloud, Gail White Eagle and Danielle Morsette.

Coast Salish artist Louie Gong (Nooksack Tribe) played an instrumental role in bringing this group of collaborators together, recommending that the jersey’s story be told through the work of these three talented women who have now brought their weaving traditions to life on a global stage, constructing The Salish Sea Kit as an authentic and novel testament to Coast Salish tradition.

The phrase “Water Is Sacred” appears on the bottom left corner of each jersey front, proudly printed in both English and Southern Lushootseed, the traditional language of the Puyallup, Muckleshoot, Suquamish and neighboring Coast Salish tribes. This powerful statement underscores the deep cultural and spiritual connection to the Salish Sea and serves as a reminder of the shared responsibility to protect it.

The neck hit features an original design that combines a wave of water, the tail of an orca and a flowing “S” that represents both the Seattle Sounders and the Salish Sea. Anchored by the club’s birth year, 1974, this motif reflects a commitment to stewardship that spans generations – connecting the past, present and future in the fight to preserve our environment.

The right jersey sleeve showcases the logo of the Puyallup Tribe, an original steward of the land throughout what is now known as the Puget Sound. The tribe and its Emerald Queen Casino have partnered with Sounders FC since 2021.

SOUNDERS FC AND VISSELL KOBE RENEW HISTORIC PARTNERSHIP

Sounders FC and Japanese club Vissel Kobe recently announced a renewal of their historic partnership, a momentous step toward strengthening global connections and celebrating the bond between sister cities Seattle and Kobe. This week marks the 30th anniversary of the two clubs' initial collaboration, and this renewed relationship will continue to foster cultural exchange, community engagement and mutual support between the clubs, their cities and fans. The partnership between the two clubs includes collaborative aspects on the technical side, including player development, scouting and squad management, in addition to marketing, digital and commercial endeavors.

The partnership between Sounders FC and Vissel Kobe was first established in 1995 in response to the devastating Kobe earthquake that affected thousands of lives. In the wake of this tragedy, the two teams united in a show of solidarity, playing two international matches – one in Kobe and one in Seattle – raising awareness and funds for earthquake relief efforts. This landmark initiative not only united two soccer clubs but also formed a lasting friendship between the cities of Seattle and Kobe, which have been sister cities since 1957.

"The bond between our two clubs and cities has always been one of special significance," said Sounders FC Owner Adrian Hanauer, who took the first step toward renewing this cherished relationship by personally reaching out to Vissel Kobe in late 2024. "As we approach the 30th anniversary of our partnership, it felt like the right time to renew our commitment to one another and explore new opportunities for collaboration. This partnership transcends soccer – it's about global community, shared values and mutual respect."

This renewal of the partnership was sparked during Hanauer's visit to Japan in December 2024 to meet with executives from Vissel Kobe (pictured above with Vissel Kobe Vice Chairman Kenichi Mikitani). Both clubs are committed to creating new opportunities for cultural exchange and youth development, with a focus on promoting soccer and strengthening the ties between Seattle and Kobe. Through this renewed collaboration, Sounders FC and Vissel Kobe will explore initiatives that bring their communities together, including friendly matches, youth camps and joint charitable events to support causes that impact both Japan and the Pacific Northwest.

"We are pleased to announce that Vissel Kobe has formed a partnership with Seattle Sounders FC," said Vissel Kobe President Yuki Chifu. "Kobe and Seattle are sister cities, and this partnership has its roots in the events following the Great Hanshin-Awaji Earthquake in 1995. In that year, Vissel Kobe visited Seattle, and the following year, in 1996, the predecessor of Seattle Sounders FC came to Kobe for a charity match. This historical connection has led to the realization of this partnership. It is an honor to collaborate with such an outstanding club as Seattle Sounders FC."






"This partnership will involve efforts on both sports and business fronts," continued Chifu. "Moving forward, we aim to deepen collaboration in various areas, including enhancing player transfers and development, creating growth opportunities for young players and promoting the discovery and nurturing of talented players through scouting and data sharing. Additionally, as a bridge between Asia and America, we are committed to enhancing the brand value of both clubs. We look forward to many years of mutual growth and success for both clubs."

To kick off the renewed partnership, Vissel Kobe has loaned defender Kaito Yamada to Tacoma Defiance for the 2025 campaign. The 18-year-old centerback has spent time with the Japan Youth National Team and now joins Sounders FC's MLS NEXT Pro side for the upcoming season, which begins later this spring.

Sounders FC and Vissel Kobe also plan to enhance their digital engagement and provide fans in both cities with unique opportunities to connect with their teams across borders. The partnership is a celebration of soccer's power to unite people around the world, creating a space for collaboration beyond the pitch. The clubs will continue to focus on mutual growth, helping to raise the profile of the beautiful game in both Japan and the United States.

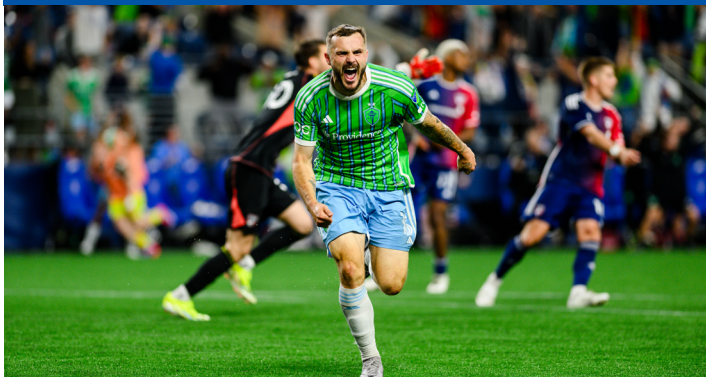
