

MATCH NOTES

- Seattle Sounders FC concludes its three-match road stretch with a visit to Providence Park to take on archrival Portland Timbers on Saturday, May 17 (6:30 p.m. PT / Apple TV, FS1, FOX Deportes, 93.3 KJR FM, El Rey 1360 AM).
- \cdot The Rave Green defeated Houston 3-1 on May 10 before falling 4-0 to LAFC on May 14 in their first two matches of this road swing.
- With the result against LAFC, Seattle currently sits in sixth place in the Western Conference with 19 points. Portland is in fourth place with 22 points, most recently coming off a 0-0 road draw with Real Salt Lake on May 14
- Sounders FC and the Timbers have faced off 40 times in the regular season since Portland joined MLS in 2011, with the two sides even with a 15-15-10 record. The clubs played to a 1-1-1 mark last year in the regular-season series.
- Dating back to 1975, Seattle and Portland have met 122 times in all competitions, with Seattle leading the all-time series 57-47-18.
- Saturday marks the first 2025 Cascadia Cup fixture for the Rave Green. The regional competition is held every year between Seattle, Portland and Vancouver. Whitecaps FC currently lead the standings with three points, defeating Portland 4-1 earlier this year.
- Seattle forward Danny Musovski became the third Sounder to score in five consecutive matches in a single season with his goal against Houston on May 10, joining Fredy Montero (2009) and Obafemi Martins (2015).
- Sounders midfielder Albert Rusnák is just two goals away from becoming the second player in MLS history to record at least 25 goals and 25 assists with multiple club.
- · Following the matchup against Portland, Seattle returns home to take on FC Dallas for the second time this year on Saturday, May 24 on the Emerald Queen Casino Pitch at Lumen Field (12:00 p.m. PT / Apple TV, iHeartMedia Seattle, El Rey 1360 AM).



DECADES OF DOMINANCE



The fiercest rivalry in American soccer returns to Seattle on Saturday when Sounders FC and the Portland Timbers meet at Providence Park for the first time this season.





Dating back to 1975, Seattle and Portland have met 122 times (Seattle leads the all-time series 57-47-18), but records and standings are thrown out the window when these two teams take the field. The two sides have battled through four decades and five competitions, beginning with the North American Soccer League in 1975. The rivalry continued through Western Soccer League (WSL), United Soccer League (USL) and Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup play before reigniting at the topflight level in the 2011 MLS season.

2024 VS. THE TIMBERS



Seattle and Portland met three times in the regular season during the 2024 campaign, finishing with an even 1-1-1 record.

The first contest between the rivals occurred on May 12 at Providence Park, with the Rave Green winning 2-1 for their first victory in the series since 2021 as Raúl Ruidíaz scored the game-winning strike from outside the box.

Portland then got its revenge on August 31, also at Providence Park when a deflected shot by Juan Mosquera found the back of the net. The Timbers were able to hold onto the clean sheet on for the 1-0 win.

The final fixture of the season came on Decision Day at Lumen Field. Yeimar scored for Seattle before Antony equalized in the second half, earning each side a point.

2025 CASCADIA CUP

Saturday marks the first match of the 2025 Cascadia Cup for Seattle. Vancouver currently leads the standings with three points after defeating Portland 4-1 earlier this season. Following Saturday's match, the Rave Green still have one match remaining against Portland the two against Vancouver Whitecaps FC.

The Cascadia Cup was formally started in 2004 by the largest supporters groups for each of the three clubs - Emerald City Supporters, Timbers Army and Vancouver Southsiders. The competition began when all three teams were members of the USL First Division and involves all three clubs, save for 2009 and 2010, when it was between the Timbers and the Whitecaps due to Seattle moving to MLS. In 2011, all three sides were in the MLS for the first time and the competition has existed in top division

Seattle forward Danny Musovski saw his streak of five consecutive matches with a goal snapped on Wednesday vs. LAFC. Five goals matches his career high in any MLS regular season since joining MLS in 2018.

With his goal against Houston on May 10, he became the third Sounder in club history to score in five-straight matches in a single regular season, joining Fredy Montero (2009) and Obafemi Martins (2015). Raúl Ruidíaz has scored in six straight regular season appearances, but it was over the course of two seasons, and he did not appear in all six matches consecutively.

Sounders FC signed Musovski prior to the 2024 season after the forward played with the San Jose Earthquakes, LAFC and Real Salt Lake. Prior to this year, Musovski scored 17 regular-season goals and tallied 10 assists since 2018.

In his fourth season with the club, midfielder Albert Rusnák is continuing to put up strong numbers in the attack, adding five goals and three assists to start the 2025 season. Since joining the club, the Slovakian has tallied 23 goals and 25 assists. He is now just two goals away from becoming the second player in MLS history to record 25 goals and 25 assists with multiple clubs in regular season play. Prior to joining Seattle, Rusnák recorded 41 goals and 39 assists for Real Salt Lake from 2017-2021. Steve Ralston also accomplished this feat, doing so with the Tampa Bay Mutiny and New England Revolution.

Rusnák signed with the club prior to the 2022 season and played an integral role in helping Seattle lift the 2022 Concacaf Champions Cup trophy.



With his appearance against Houston on May 10, Stefan Frei recorded his 500th career all-competition appearance since joining MLS in 2009. Originally a member of Toronto FC, the ironman and club captain has won more trophies than any player in Sounders history: two MLS Cups (2016, 2019), one Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup (2014), one Supporters' Shield (2024) and one Concacaf Champions Cup (2022). He also won four Canadian Championships with Toronto (2009-2012).

He recently played his 400th match with Seattle, becoming the seventh player in MLS history to reach that milestone with one club.


RYAN KENT MAKING AN INSTANT IMPACT



Sounders FC newly-acquired midfielder Ryan Kent has made his presence known since he signed with the club on March 31. The Englishman recorded three assists in his first 116 minutes of play, becoming the fastest Sounder to record three assists in club history.

He bagged two helpers on May 3 against St. Louis in just 34 minutes of play in a substitute appearance before assisting Rusnák's second goal against Houston on May 10 following an impressive solo run into the 18-yard box.

The midfielder previously spent his career at various teams across Europe, including five seasons with Scotland's Rangers from 2018 to 2022, scoring 34 goals in 216 appearances across all competitions.

The agreement brings both Reign FC and Sounders FC onto the same audio broadcast platform for the first time, stretching across iHeartMedia Seattle's complete complement of affiliates – from Sports Radio 93.3 KJR FM to 950 KJR AM and on the iHeartRadio app.

iHeartMedia Seattle is poised to bring Pacific Northwest soccer fans wall-to-wall coverage of the teams they love in the years ahead, spearheaded by industry-leading in-match coverage.

For Sounders FC, all MLS matches – including the MLS Cup Playoffs – are set for air on Sports Radio 93.3 KJR FM, 950 KJR AM or on the iHeartRadio app. Each broadcast includes full pre and post-match shows, alongside live play-by-play throughout the MLS season.

For Reign FC, the new partnership with iHeartMedia Seattle provides the club a terrestrial radio and streaming audio platform for the first time in team history. This season, six matches will air on 950 KJR AM or via the iHeartRadio app, including a pre-match show and full in-match coverage. In subsequent seasons, 10 NWSL matches will be carried across iHeartMedia Seattle's platforms.

For fans of both clubs, leading Sports Radio KJR talent like Dave "Softy" Mahler, Dick Fain and Jackson Felts are set to be onsite at Lumen Field for select matches of both clubs, conducting live remotes, interacting with fans and appearing on the teams' pre-match shows, bringing fan-favorite voices directly to the Seattle soccer community.

Sounders Weekly returns for its ninth season in 2025. The magazine-style weekly show on 93.3 KJR FM is hosted by Jackson Felts, offering insider updates, player interviews and analysis from around the soccer world every Wednesday throughout the season at 7:00 p.m. PT.

New in 2025, Sounders Weekly expands to 90 minutes to include a dedicated 30-minute Reign FC spotlight, featuring the club's players, coaches and top storylines.

In addition, Sounders FC Head Coach Brian Schmetzer's weekly segment on Dave "Softy" Mahler and Dick Fain's show continues every Tuesday at 5:45 p.m. PT throughout the MLS season, while fans of both teams can expect regular player and coach interviews across KJR's programming throughout the MLS and NWSL seasons. Additionally, team promotions, player audio drops and studio-produced promotional content will provide a steady drumbeat alongside match coverage and shoulder programming.



In a groundbreaking moment for Seattle soccer, Seattle Sounders FC and Seattle Reign FC on May 1 announced a historic multi-year partnership with FOX 13 Seattle, creating a unified broadcast platform for both clubs for the first time in the region's storied soccer history.

This landmark collaboration, designating FOX 13 Seattle as the Official Flagship Local Broadcast Partner of both Sounders FC and Reign FC, underscores the combined strength and growing impact of men's and women's professional soccer. It represents a major step forward in providing fans expansive and inclusive coverage, celebrating Seattle's rich soccer tradition on a shared stage.

Effective immediately, the first Reign FC contest on FOX 13's air kicks off on Friday, May 2 live from Lumen Field, as the home side takes on the Kansas City Current at 7:30 p.m. PT. For Sounders FC, the partnership includes a diverse array of shoulder programming, news and sports coverage, in addition to inseason specials and features throughout the year. Live Sounders FC matches continue to air on MLS Season Pass on Apple TV.

FOX 13 is continuing its strong coverage of Sounders FC and industry-leading reporting throughout the MLS season, and now becomes the official matchday broadcast home of Reign FC. Including onsite talent and production, this marks the first time in club history that Reign FC has integrated, on-location production services for its games. 11 NWSL matches are slated for air this season, with FOX 13's trusted on-air talent and dedicated crews providing blanket coverage, bringing fans closer to their favorite teams throughout the year.

Beyond match broadcasts, FOX 13 and the clubs are investing in expanded programming designed to deepen fan connections and build awareness of the many happenings across the Puget Sound soccer scene.

Featuring cool green and blue tones evoking Pacific Northwestern waters and a unique pattern derived from Coast Salish weaving traditions in collaboration with indigenous artists representing the Puyallup, Muckleshoot and Suquamish Tribes, The Salish Sea Kit serves a call to protect what sustains us and to celebrate the connections that make us whole.

This one-of-a-kind kit also has purpose beyond the pitch. Sounders FC is committed to donating proceeds up to \$50,000 from the first 30 days of The Salish Sea Kit's sales to organizations dedicated to preserving the cultural heritage of tribal communities and protecting the Salish Sea's remarkable ecosystem, including: The Burke Museum, Potlatch Fund, Puget Soundkeeper, Seattle Aquarium and RAVE Foundation.

These funds will be thoughtfully invested to support youth education and arts programs honoring the traditions of Washington State's tribal communities, advance conservation efforts to restore the health of the Salish Sea and provide meaningful experiences for tribal youth, including educational field trips and opportunities to attend Sounders FC matches.

Through these initiatives, Sounders FC aims to honor the interconnectedness of the region's people and environment, creating a legacy that uplifts communities and inspires stewardship of the Salish Sea.

Born at the water's edge in 1974, Sounders FC has been inextricably connected to the Puget Sound from the club's earliest days. But the waters of the Sound – part of the greater Salish Sea – have a history far deeper and vaster, stretching back through the generations to time immemorial. The Salish Sea flows both literally through its waters and figuratively through its spirit, sustaining life and building strong communities. Sounders FC's Salish Sea Kit honors water as a lifeforce and a vessel for rich cultural traditions.

The jersey's striking geometric pattern suggests a sense of dimensionality and flow, inspired by twilling and twining, two traditional Southern Coast Salish weaving techniques. These techniques, passed down through generations, pay respect to the resilience, connection and creativity that define the cultural fabric of the region.

The design draws directly from the artistry of three distinguished indigenous Pacific Northwestern artists Connie McCloud, Gail White Eagle and Danielle Morsette.

Coast Salish artist Louie Gong (Nooksack Tribe) played an instrumental role in bringing this group of collaborators together, recommending that the jersey's story be told through the work of these three talented women who have now brought their weaving traditions to life on a global stage, constructing The Salish Sea Kit as an authentic and novel testament to Coast Salish tradition.

The phrase "Water Is Sacred" appears on the bottom left corner of each jersey front, proudly printed in both English and Southern Lushootseed, the traditional language of the Puyallup, Muckleshoot, Suquamish and neighboring Coast Salish tribes. This powerful statement underscores the deep cultural and spiritual connection to the Salish Sea and serves as a reminder of the shared responsibility to protect it.

The neck hit features an original design that combines a wave of water, the tail of an orca and a flowing "S" that represents both the Seattle Sounders and the Salish Sea. Anchored by the club's birth year, 1974, this motif reflects a commitment to stewardship that spans generations – connecting the past, present and future in the fight to preserve our environment.

The right jersey sleeve showcases the logo of the Puyallup Tribe, an original steward of the land throughout what is now known as the Puget Sound. The tribe and its Emerald Queen Casino have partnered with Sounders FC since 2021.
