### MATCH NOTES

- Seattle Sounders FC travels to Inter Miami CF for a rematch of the Leagues Cup 2025 Final on Tuesday, September 16 at Chase Stadium (4:30 p.m. PT / Apple TV, iHeartMedia Seattle, El Rey 1360 AM).

- Seattle and Miami faced off just two weeks ago in the Leagues Cup Final, a match that the Rave Green won 3-0 to hoist their ninth trophy since joining MLS in 2009.

- In MLS play, Seattle sits in fourth place in the Western Conference with 45 points (12-7-9). Miami is in eighth place in the East with 46 points (13-6-7).

- Tuesday marks just the second time that these two teams have met in league play. Miami won the lone contest played at Lumen Field 1-0 on April 16, 2022.

- Seattle forward Jesús Ferreira scored his 57th career regular-season goal on Saturday against the LA Galaxy, the most goals before the age of 25 in MLS history. Ferreira was previously tied with Landon Donovan.

- Rave Green striker Danny Musovski also scored against LA on Saturday, his 16th goal in all competitions this year and 14th in league play. He is three goals away from tying Obafemi Martins (2014) and Raúl Ruidíaz (2021) for the club single-season scoring record of 19 in all competitions.

- Seattle can clinch a berth in the Audi 2025 MLS Cup Playoffs with a win against Miami coupled with a Real Salt Lake loss or draw against LAFC on Wednesday.

- Since competing in the FIFA Club World Cup 2025™ in June, Seattle has only lost one match in all competitions, compiling a 10-1-5 record, including a 5-0-1 record in Leagues Cup play. Seattle has also scored 41 goals in those 16 matches.

- Following Tuesday's match in Miami, Seattle faces another road test against Austin FC on Sunday, September 21 at Q2 Stadium (4:00 p.m. PT / Apple TV, iHeartMedia Seattle, El Rey 1360 AM).

## LAST TIME VS. INTER MIAMI



Seattle and Miami met just two weeks ago at Lumen Field for the Leagues Cup 2025 Final, a match that Seattle won 3-0 to capture its ninth trophy in club history since 2009 (see next page 4).

Sounders FC came into the match missing some of its most productive players - Danny Musovski (the team's leading scorer this year) and Nouhou were out due to suspension, while Designated Players Albert Rusnák and Jordan Morris were out due to injury. Head Coach Brian Schmetzer fielded a lineup featuring younger talent such as Osaze De Rosario and Reed Baker-Whiting, opposite of Lionel Messi and Miami's star-studded squad.

It took little time for De Rosario to make his mark, scoring in the 26th minute off a pinpoint cross from Alex Roldan. The score stayed the same for much of the match until Roldan then converted a penalty in the 84th minute, with Paul Rothrock adding the goal to seal the match in the 89th minute.

The trophy completed the set for Seattle, which has now won every major North American trophy available to them (see page 4).

## SFC LOOKING TO CLINCH PLAYOFF BERTH

Seattle can clinch a playoff berth this week with a win against Inter Miami on Tuesday coupled with a draw or loss by Real Salt Lake against LAFC on Wednesday.

Should the Rave Green earn their ticket to the Audi 2025 MLS Cup Playoffs, it would be the 16th time in their 17 years of existence in MLS that they've made the postseason. That number is good for the most among any expansion team in MLS history.

Seattle has reached the MLS Cup Final on four occasions (2016, 2017, 2019, 2020) and won the trophy in 2016 and 2019. Head Coach Brian Schmetzer has been at the helm for each appearance in the final match.

## SEATTLE WINS LEAGUES CUP 2025



Seattle Sounders FC captured the Leagues Cup 2025 trophy on August 31 with a 3-0 win over Inter Miami CF, the first Leagues Cup title in club history. The title capped off a dominant run for the Rave Green throughout the tournament, compiling a 5-0-1 record and outscoring their opponents by 14 goals (16 goals for, two against).

Sounders FC cruised through Phase One play, becoming the only team in the tournament, MLS or Liga MX, to win all three of its matches, including a dominant 7-0 victory over Cruz Azul. The club then defeated Club Puebla in a shootout following a 0-0 draw in the Quarterfinals, setting up a Semifinals matchup against the LA Galaxy at Dignity Health Sports Park, which Seattle won 2-0 behind goals from Pedro de la Vega and Osaze De Rosario.

Seattle then hosted the final against Miami in front of a Leagues Cup and club-record single-match crowd of 69,314 at Lumen Field. De Rosario scored in the first half, with Alex Roldan bagging a penalty in the second half and Paul Rothrock adding the exclamation point, as goalkeeper Andrew Thomas kept the clean sheet to win 3-0.

Three members of the Rave Green won individual awards: Pedro de la Vega won Player of the Tournament, Andrew Thomas won Goalkeeper of the Tournament and Alex Roldan won Most Valuable Player for the Final.

## THE RAVE GREEN OWN 'EM ALL



By winning Leagues Cup 2025, Seattle became the first soccer team in North America to win all five major trophies available to them - MLS Cup, Supporters' Shield, Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, Concacaf Champions Cup and one Leagues Cup.

Since joining MLS in 2009, Seattle's nine trophies - four U.S. Open Cups, two MLS Cups, one Supporters' Shield, one Concacaf Champions Cup and one Leagues Cup - are the most among any team in MLS since 2009, and are three more than the next-closest team, the LA Galaxy.

August 31 marked Seattle's 13th final since joining MLS. The club holds a 8-3-2 record in those contests. It was also the fifth final that Seattle has played at home, boasting a perfect 5-0-0 record and tied the largest margin of victory ever in a final (3-0 win against Pumas UNAM in 2022 Concacaf Champions Cup Final).

Head Coach Brian Schmetzer has been at the helm for four of Seattle's nine titles (2016 and 2019 MLS Cups, 2022 Concacaf Champions Cup and 2025 Leagues Cup) and has reached eight different finals.

## JESÚS FERREIRA MAKES HISTORY



Jesús Ferreira's goal against the LA Galaxy on September 13 was good for his 57th regular-season strike since joining MLS in 2017, the most goals by a player before the age of 25 in MLS history, breaking a tie with Landon Donovan.

Ferreira (24 years, 266 days) was acquired by Seattle via trade from FC Dallas this offseason and has proven to be a valuable member of Seattle's attack. He has provided 14 goal contributions in all competitions for Seattle this year, including nine assists.

Prior to joining Seattle, Ferreira was a standout with FC Dallas, tallying 55 goals and 40 assists in all competitions from 2017-2024. He was named MLS Young Player of the Year in 2022 following an 18-goal, six-assist campaign and was also named an MLS All-Star in 2022 and 2023, as well as to the MLS Best XI in 2022.

## RAVE GREEN FLYING SINCE CLUB WORLD CUP



Seattle has only lost one match since competing in the FIFA Club World Cup 2025™ in June, compiling a 10-1-5 record in all competitions since the tournament, including a 5-0-1 record during its title-winning Leagues Cup 2025 run.

The results have not only helped the Rave Green win Leagues Cup 2025 but also stay near the top of the Western Conference, currently sitting in fourth place with 45 points (12-7-9).

The club is also scoring at a frantic pace, bagging 41 goals in the 16 matches since the Club World Cup, including a seven-goal outburst against Cruz Azul in its opening Leagues Cup match as well as five goals against Sporting Kansas City and four goals against the LA Galaxy in MLS play.

## SEATTLE SETS ATTENDANCE RECORD



Sounders FC set a single-match club attendance record on August 31 against Miami in the Leagues Cup 2025 Final, with 69,314 fans packing Lumen Field to see Seattle win its ninth trophy in club history. This marks the 10th time in club history that Lumen Field has hosted over 60,000 fans for a competitive match, including two previous cup finals: 2019 MLS Cup (69,274) and 2022 Concacaf Champions Cup (68,741). Seattle has a 9-0-1 record in those matches.

Seattle is no stranger to the biggest stages in international football. Earlier this summer, more than 132,000 fans came through the turnstiles to see Sounders FC's three Group Stage matches at the FIFA Club World Cup 2025™ against continental champions Paris Saint-Germain and Botafogo along with perennial La Liga contender Atlético Madrid. Additionally, Seattle set a Concacaf Champions Cup single-match attendance record on May 4, 2022, when 68,741 fans watched the Rave Green become the first and only MLS team to claim the continental crown against Pumas UNAM. The Emerald City also set a then-Lumen Field event record of 69,274 fans for the 2019 MLS Cup, as Seattle earned its second league championship in emphatic fashion over Toronto FC.

## MUSOVSKI CAN'T STOP SCORING



Sounders FC forward Danny Musovski is enjoying a career year in 2025. With his \*goal\* against LA on Saturday, he now has 16 goals in all competitions, the most he has ever scored as a professional. He bagged his first career hat trick in a 5-2 win over Sporting Kansas City on August 24. His 16 strikes are three shy of the club's single-season goal scoring record of 19 set by Obafemi Martins in 2014 and Raúl Ruidíaz in 2021.

Musovski's previous career high was 11 goals, set in 2019 when he played for USL Championship side Reno 1868 FC. His previous high in MLS was nine, set in 2023 while playing for Real Salt Lake.

## INTERNATIONAL SOUNDERS



Six Sounders FC players were called-up to their respective national teams for the September FIFA window: Cristian Roldan (United States), Nouhou (Cameroon), Georgi Minoungou (Burkina Faso), Obed Vargas (Mexico U-20s), Reed Baker-Whiting (U.S. U-20s) and Snyder Brunell (U.S. U-19s). Tacoma Defiance goalkeeper Mohammed Shour has also been called into the U.S. U-20 MYNT.

Roldan, 30, received his first callup to the U.S. Men's National Team under Head Coach Mauricio Pochettino, reporting for a camp in New Jersey and appeared in both friendlies against Korea Republic and Japan. The midfielder has 39 career caps for the USMNT and was part of the squad at the 2022 FIFA World Cup Qatar. Prior to this month, he most recently appeared for the *Stars and Stripes* during the 2023 Concacaf Gold Cup, where he played in all five of the nation's fixtures in the tournament and recorded an assist in a 6-0 win over Saint Kitts and Nevis. The midfielder played 28 minutes in a 2-0 loss to South Korea on September 6 and a full 90-minute shift against Japan in a 2-0 win on September 9. Roldan has 38 appearances (35 starts) for Seattle this season in all competitions, scoring two goals and recording a team-high 10 assists. Since being selected by Seattle in the First Round of the 2015 MLS SuperDraft, Roldan ranks second in club history (MLS era) with 384 appearances across all competitions, sixth with 44 goals and second with 67 assists.

Nouhou, 27, has 40 career caps for Cameroon since 2017, playing every minute in all three of Cameroon's 2022 FIFA World Cup™ matches, including the country's historic 1-0 win over Brazil. The Douala native most recently started a pair of FIFA World Cup 2026™ qualifying matches in March, playing every minute of both contests. During the September break, Nouhou appeared for *Les Lions Indomptables* in a FIFA World Cup qualifying match against Cape Verde, playing all 90 minutes in the 1-0 loss. Nouhou has 31 appearances (29 starts) in all competitions for Seattle this year, scoring one goal.

Minoungou, 23, earned his first career international callup during the September window, joining Burkina Faso for a pair of FIFA World Cup 2026™ qualifying matches against Djibouti on September 5 and Egypt on September 9. The midfielder made substitute appearances in both matches, playing 45 minutes in a 6-0 win over Djibouti and 17 minutes in a 0-0 draw with Egypt. Minoungou has 24 appearances (five starts) in all competitions for Seattle this year, recording one goal and four assists.

Vargas, 20, got the nod with the Mexico U-20s to continue preparation for the 2025 FIFA U-20 World Cup after joining the squad during the March window earlier this year. The midfielder earned his first cap with the Mexico senior team in October 2024 with a substitute appearance against the United States in a 2-0 victory. He was also called into Mexico's U-23 squad during the September 2024 window for a training camp and pair of friendlies. Vargas has started all 35 of his appearances in all competitions this year, scoring three goals and adding six assists.

Baker-Whiting, 20, joined the U.S. U-20 MYNT for training camp in San Pedro del Pinatar, Spain and two friendlies against Morocco as the team continues preparations for the FIFA U-20 World Cup in Chile. Baker-Whiting has previously joined the U-20s in June for a camp in Cairo, Egypt and has played for the USMYNT at both the U-17 and U-19 levels. The Seattle native has appeared in 15 matches (eight starts) in all, competitions for the Rave Green this year,

including a 90-minute shift opposite Lionel Messi in Seattle's 3-0 win over Inter Miami CF in the Leagues Cup 2025 Final on August 31.

Brunell, 18, joined the U.S. U-19 MYNT for a Domestic Identity Camp in Fayetteville, Georgia. The midfielder previously joined the U-18s for the UEFA Friendship Cup in Nyon, Switzerland, winning the title with a shootout win over Portugal. Brunell signed with Seattle in July and has scored two goals in four appearances (one start) for the club in all competitions.

Shour, 17, also joins the U.S. U-20 MYNT for a Domestic Identity Camp in West Palm Beach, Florida. Shour signed with Defiance prior to the 2025 season and has six appearances, making 18 saves.

## RAVE GREEN LOAN TWO DEFENDERS



Sounders FC announced on September 8 that it has loaned defenders Cody Baker and Travian Sousa to USL Championship sides Sacramento Republic FC and FC Tulsa, respectively, until the end of the 2025 USL Championship season. Baker signed with Seattle during the 2023 season, while Sousa joined prior to the 2025 campaign.

Baker, 21, has made 33 all-competition appearances (16 starts) for Seattle, including three this year, most recently playing a 90-minute shift against Sporting Kansas City in a 5-2 win on August 24. The Homegrown Player has recorded two all-competitions assists in his career, including one in Seattle's 5-4 win over the San Diego Loyal in the 2023 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup. Prior to his time with Sounders FC, Baker played for Tacoma Defiance from 2021-2023, making 40 appearances (25 starts) and scoring one goal. He originally joined the club via the Sounders Discovery Program in 2015 before moving on to play for the academy.

Sousa, 23, signed with Seattle prior to the 2025 campaign after three seasons with Defiance from 2022-2024. The Lathrop, California native became a mainstay in the starting lineup for Defiance, making 27 appearances (23 starts) including playoffs in 2024, scoring a goal against The Town FC while adding four assists. From 2022-2023, Sousa made 41 appearances (27 starts) for Tacoma (including postseason), scoring two goals and tallying six assists. Prior to joining Defiance, Sousa played for Hamburger SV in Germany from 2019-2020 before spending the 2021 season with Oakland Roots SC and Sporting Kansas City II.

## SOUNDERS FC CELEBRATES LATINE HERITAGE MONTH



Seattle Sounders FC, Seattle Reign FC and their charitable partner RAVE Foundation announced on September 12 the clubs' plans to commemorate Latine Heritage Month – an annual recognition that celebrates the diversity of culture and heritage within the Latine community.

As the Rave Green kick off Latine Heritage Month – which runs from September 15 to October 15 each year – the club recognizes the complexity of the language used. As clubs, Sounders and Reign are committed to supporting individuals of all backgrounds and have chosen to use the term "Latine" to foster the most inclusive environment for all. By using this gender-inclusive language, the clubs reaffirm their commitments to advancing equity, supporting those who do not identify within the gender binary and acknowledging the intersectional identities held by the Seattle soccer community. The clubs have updated their language from the previously used "Latinx", a community-informed decision that follows conventions of romance languages, such as Spanish and Portuguese. While this is the language Sounders FC and Reign FC feel align most with their organizational values, the clubs encourage fans to identify in whichever ways feel most true to themselves.

This year, Sounders FC is teaming up with the Consulate of Mexico in Seattle, Sea Mar Community Health Centers, KEXP and Intentionalist to provide a handful of activities in recognition to the Latine community, with a full list of this year's events and matchday activations available below.

Sounders FC is taking part in this year's Sea Mar Fiestas Patrias Parade, marching proudly while engaging with community members and giving away Sounders FC-branded items. The parade, a celebration of the community and all that it has to offer, will take place on Saturday, September 13 from 10:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. PT at Sea Mar Community Health Centers Administration (1040 South Henderson Street, Seattle, WA 98108).

Sounders FC, Reign FC and RAVE Foundation are teaming up with longtime partner Sea Mar Community Health Centers to kickoff Latine Heritage Month at this year's Sea Mar Fiestas Patrias, a two-day community event that brings together families, businesses and cultural organizations to honor Latin American traditions. Throughout the two-day event at Seattle Center, attendees can enjoy delicious traditional Latin American food, live music, traditional folk-dance performances, a health fair offering health information, free health screenings, Zumba and Viva Art Exhibit, children's activities and more.

The festival is taking place this year on Saturday, September 13 from 12:00 – 9:00 p.m. PT and on Sunday, September 14 from 11:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. PT at the Armory Food & Event Hall and Fisher Pavilion (305 Harrison Street, Seattle, WA 98109). The event is part of the Seattle Center Festal series and is free and open to the public.

Once at Seattle Center, those in attendance will have the opportunity to participate in a variety of onsite entertainment including a free soccer clinic on Saturday, September 13 from 1:00 – 3:00 p.m. PT at the Fisher Pavilion rooftop, as well as the giveaway of 200 soccer ball for youth attendees.

The 2025 theme, "Our Voice, Our Strength," celebrates the color, culture, customs and languages that define Latine proud heritage. It emphasizes the importance of unity within this diversity, recognizing that we are all part of a single global community, enriched by many vibrant cultures and perspectives.

On Saturday, September 13, as Sounders FC hosts the LA Galaxy on the Emerald Queen Casino Pitch at Lumen Field, the club is celebrating Latine Heritage Month with its Vamos Sounders Celebration match. Those attending the match on Saturday will have the opportunity to receive an exclusive winged-orca poster upon arrival at the stadium. Crafted by Mexican Art Director, Graphic Designer and Seattle-based illustrator Víctor Meléndez, the free posters represent a tribute to Mexican alebrijes, a brightly colored folk art sculpture inspired by symbolic animal parts and vibrant colors with specific cultural significance, representing the diversity of our Sounders community.
