MATCH NOTES

- \cdot Seattle Sounders FC travels to Austin FC for a match at Q2 Stadium on Sunday, September 21 (4:00 p.m. PT / Apple TV, iHeartMedia Seattle, El Rey 1360 AM).
- Seattle currently sits in fifth place in the Western Conference with 45 points (12-8-9), most recently coming off a 3-1 road loss to Inter Miami on September 16. Austin is in seventh place in the West with 41 points (11-10-8).
- The two sides met earlier this year on June 28 at Lumen Field, a 2-0 win for the Rave Green. Jesús Ferreira and Danny Musovski scored in the contest. Seattle has a 5-1-3 all-time record against Austin, including a 3-0-1 record at Q2 Stadium.
- Seattle can clinch a berth in the Audi 2025 MLS Cup Playoffs with a win against Austin or a draw against Austin FC coupled with a loss or draw by Real Salt Lake against LAFC.
- Sounders FC announced this week that Reed Baker-Whiting has signed a new contract with the club through the 2028 season. The Seattle native will occupy a U-22 Initiative slot with the new deal.
- · Baker-Whiting (USA) and Obed Vargas (Mexico) have both been called up to their national teams for the FIFA U-20 World Cup, taking place in Chile from September 27 October 20. The two will depart for the tournament following Sunday's match at Austin.
- · Since competing in the FIFA Club World Cup 2025 $^{\text{TM}}$ in June, Seattle has only lost two matches in all competitions, compiling a 10-2-5 record. Seattle has also scored 42 goals in those 17 matches.
- · Following Sunday's match, the Rave Green return home for three straight home matches, beginning with a Cascadia clash against Vancouver Whitecaps FC on Saturday, September 27 on the Emerald Queen Casino Pitch at Lumen Field (7:30 p.m. PT / Apple TV, iHeartMedia Seattle, El Rey 1360 AM).

SFC RECORD: 5-1-3 (3-0-1 ON THE ROAD)

JULY 2021 REWIND: THE TEENAGERS SHINE



One of the most infamous matches of Seattle's MLS history took place against Austin FC during the Texas side's inaugural season on July 22, 2021. Brian Schmetzer fielded five teenagers – Reed Baker-Whiting, Obed Vargas, Danny Leyva, Ethan Dobbelaere and Josh Atencio – for the road match due to multiple starters being unavailable for selection, the first and only time in league history five teenagers started a competitive match.

After a scoreless first half, Raúl Ruidíaz subbed on and scored a stunning goal from midfield in the 67th minute to secure the 1-0 victory for the Rave Green, keeping them in first place in the Western Conference.

SFC LOOKING TO CLINCH PLAYOFF BERTH

Seattle can clinch a playoff berth this weekend with two different scenarios:

- · Seattle Sounders FC WIN at Austin FC
- \cdot Seattle Sounders FC DRAW at Austin FC AND Colorado Rapids LOSS at FC Dallas AND Real Salt Lake LOSS/DRAW at LAFC AND San Jose Earthquakes LOSS/DRAW vs. St. Louis CITY SC

Should the Rave Green earn their ticket to the Audi 2025 MLS Cup Playoffs, it would be the 16th time in their 17 years of exsistence in MLS that they've made the postseason. That number is good for the most among any expansion team in MLS history.

Seattle has reached the MLS Cup Final on four occasions (2016, 2017, 2019, 2020) and won the trophy in 2016 and 2019. Head Coach Brian Schmetzer has been at the helm for each appearance in the final match.

SEATTLE WINS LEAGUES CUP 2025



Seattle Sounders FC captured the Leagues Cup 2025 trophy on August 31 with a 3-0 win over Inter Miami CF, the first Leagues Cup title in club history. The title capped off a dominant run for the Rave Green throughout the tournament, compiling a 5-0-1 record and outscoring their opponents by 14 goals (16 goals for, two against).

Sounders FC cruised through Phase One play, becoming the only team in the tournament, MLS or Liga MX, to win all three of its matches, including a dominant 7-0 victory over Cruz Azul. The club then defeated Club Puebla in a shootout following a 0-0 draw in the Quarterfinals, setting up a Semifinals matchup against the LA Galaxy at Dignity Health Sports Park, which Seattle won 2-0 behind goals from Pedro de la Vega and Osaze De Rosario.

Seattle then hosted the final against Miami in front of a Leagues Cup and club-record single-match crowd of 69,314 at Lumen Field. De Rosario scored in the first half, with Alex Roldan bagging a penalty in the second half and Paul Rothrock adding the exclamation point, as goalkeeper Andrew Thomas kept the clean sheet to win 3-0.

Three members of the Rave Green won individual awards: Pedro de la Vega won Player of the Tournament, Andrew Thomas won Goalkeeper of the Tournament and Alex Roldan won Most Valuable Player for the Final.

THE RAVE GREEN OWN 'EM ALL



By winning Leagues Cup 2025, Seattle became the first soccer team in North America to win all five major trophies available to them - MLS Cup, Supporters' Shield, Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, Concacaf Champions Cup and one Leagues Cup.

Since joining MLS in 2009, Seattle's nine trophies - four U.S. Open Cups, two MLS Cups, one Supporters' Shield, one Concacaf Champions Cup and one Leagues Cup - are the most among any team in MLS since 2009, and are three more than the next-closest team, the LA Galaxy.

August 31 marked Seattle's 13th final since joining MLS. The club holds a 8-3-2 record in those contests. It was also the fifth final that Seattle has played at home, boasting a perfect 5-0-0 record and tied the largest margin of victory ever in a final (3-0 win against Pumas UNAM in 2022 Concacaf Champions Cup Final).

Head Coach Brian Schmetzer has been at the helm for four of Seattle's nine titles (2016 and 2019 MLS Cups, 2022 Concacaf Champions Cup and 2025 Leagues Cup) and has reached eight different finals.



Jesús Ferreira's goal against the LA Galaxy on September 13 was good for his 57th regular-season strike since joining MLS in 2017, the most goals by a player before the age of 25 in MLS history, breaking a tie with Landon Donovan.

Ferreira (24 years, 266 days) was acquired by Seattle via trade from FC Dallas this offseason and has proven to be a valuable member of Seattle's attack. He has provided 14 goal contributions in all competitions for Seattle this year, including nine assists.

Prior to joining Seattle, Ferreira was a standout with FC Dallas, tallying 55 goals and 40 assists in all competitions from 2017-2024. He was named MLS Young Player of the Year in 2022 following an 18-goal, six-assist campaign and was also named an MLS All-Star in 2022 and 2023, as well as to the MLS Best XI in 2022.

RAVE GREEN FLYING SINCE CLUB WORLD CUP



Seattle has only lost two matches since competing in the FIFA Club World Cup 2025™ in June, compiling a 10-2-5 record in all competitions since the tournament, including a 5-0-1 record during its title-winning Leagues Cup 2025 run.

The results have not only helped the Rave Green win Leagues Cup 2025 but also stay in the hunt for home field in the playoffs, currently sitting in fith place with 45 points (12-8-9).

The club is also scoring at a frantic pace, bagging 42 goals in the 16 matches since the Club World Cup, including a seven-goal outburst against Cruz Azul in its opening Leagues Cup match as well as five goals against Sporting Kansas City and four goals against the LA Galaxy in MLS play.

SEATTLE SETS ATTENDANCE RECORD



Sounders FC set a single-match club attendance record on August 31 against Miami in the Leagues Cup 2025 Final, with 69,314 fans packing Lumen Field to see Seattle win its ninth trophy in club history. This marks the 10th time in club history that Lumen Field has hosted over 60,000 fans for a competitive match, including two previous cup finals: 2019 MLS Cup (69,274) and 2022 Concacaf Champions Cup (68,741). Seattle has a 9-0-1 record in those matches.

Seattle is no stranger to the biggest stages in international football. Earlier this summer, more than 132,000 fans came through the turnstiles to see Sounders FC's three Group Stage matches at the FIFA Club World Cup 2025™ against continental champions Paris Saint-Germain and Botafogo along with perennial La Liga contender Atlético Madrid. Additionally, Seattle set a Concacaf Champions Cup single-match attendance record on May 4, 2022, when 68,741 fans watched the Rave Green become the first and only MLS team to claim the continental crown against Pumas UNAM. The Emerald City also set a then-Lumen Field event record of 69,274 fans for the 2019 MLS Cup, as Seattle earned its second league championship in emphatic fashion over Toronto FC.

MUSOVSKI CAN'T STOP SCORING



Sounders FC forward Danny Musovski is enjoying a career year in 2025. With his strike against LA on Saturday, he now has 16 goals in all competitions, the most he has ever scored as a professional. He bagged his first career hat trick in a 5-2 win over Sporting Kansas City on August 24. His 16 goals are three shy of the club's single-season goal scoring record of 19 set by Obafemi Martins in 2014 and Raúl Ruidíaz in 2021.

Musovski's previous career high was 11 goals, set in 2019 when he played for USL Championship side Reno 1868 FC. His previous high in MLS was nine, set in 2023 while playing for Real Salt Lake.

TWO SOUNDERS CALLED UP FOR U-20 WC



Reed Baker-Whiting and Obed Vargas have been named to the final rosters for the United States and Mexico, respectively, for the 2025 FIFA U-20 World Cup^{TM} . The pair of Homegrown Players will represent the Rave Green in the global tournament taking place from September 27 to October 19 in Chile. Both players are set to depart following Sunday's match at Austin FC and will miss, at minimum, Sounders FC's following two matches against Vancouver (September 27) and Portland (October 4).

"Having both Reed and Obed called up to represent their country at the U-20 World Cup is a proud moment for our entire organization," said Sounders FC General Manager & Chief Soccer Officer Craig Waibel. "It's a reflection of the work they've put in and the commitment of our development pathway to prepare players for opportunities like this. Competing on the world stage will be a valuable experience for both of them, and we're excited to see how it helps their continued growth as professionals."

Baker-Whiting, 20, has represented the United States at the U-17, U-19 and U-20 levels, most recently being called up for a camp with the U-20s in San Pedre del Pintar, Spain during the September FIFA window. The Seattle native has appeared in 17 matches (nine starts) in all competitions for the Rave Green this year, including a 90-minute shift opposite Lionel Messi in Seattle's 3-0 win over Inter Miami CF in the Leagues Cup 2025 Final on August 31. The Seattle native recently signed a new contract with the club through at least the 2028 season. The Stars and Stripes are drawn into Group E and will begin tournament play against New Caledonia on September 29 (4:00 p.m. PT / FS1) before facing France on October 2 (1:00 p.m. PT / FS2) and South Africa on October 5 (1:00 p.m. PT / FS2).

"It's always special when players from our club are called in to play on the biggest stage, and we're proud of both Reed and Obed for earning this opportunity," said Sounders FC Head Coach Brian Schmetzer. "They've each put in a lot of hard work in training and have shown the commitment it takes to grow at this level. Competing at the U-20 World Cup will only improve their abilities, and we're looking forward to seeing how it helps the club when they return."

Vargas, 20, also was called-up during the September FIFA window for a camp with the Mexico U-20s. The midfielder earned his first cap with the Mexico senior team in October 2024 with a substitute appearance against the United States in a 2-0 victory. He was also called into Mexico's U-23 squad during the September 2024 window for a training camp and pair of friendlies. Vargas has started all 37 of his appearances in all competitions this year, scoring four goals and adding seven assists. El Tri is competing in Group C, facing off against Brazil on September 28 (4:00 p.m. PT / FS1), Spain on October 1 (1:00 p.m. / FS2) and Morocco on October 4 (1:00 p.m. PT).

Additionally, Tacoma Defiance interim Head Coach Mike Morris will be serving as an Assistant Coach for the U.S. U-20 Men's Youth National Team during the tournament. Morris has been with Sounders FC since the club formed in 2009 and has been a longtime integral member of the club's development programs. The Washington native took over sideline duties for Defiance after the club parted ways with Hervé Diese earlier this season.

BAKER-WHITING SIGNS NEW CONTRACT



Sounders FC today has signed Reed Baker-Whiting to a new contract through the 2028 season with a club option for 2029. The Seattle native has made 77 appearances in all competitions as a midfielder and fullback since originally signing with the club as a Homegrown Player in May of 2021. Baker-Whiting will now occupy a U-22 roster spot with the new deal.

"Reed is a young and promising talent who's already shown a lot of maturity in his time with the club," said Sounders FC General Manager & Chief Soccer Officer Craig Waibel. "We're pleased to have him continue his journey with us and believe this new contract reflects the potential we see in him."

Baker-Whiting, 20, has 17 appearances in all competitions for Seattle this year, including two in the FIFA Club World Cup 2025™ and three in the club's championship run at Leagues Cup 2025. He scored his lone goal with Sounders FC in the 2023 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup against the San Diego Loyal, helping the team to an extra-time victory. The Seattle native has appeared in four career postseason matches for the Rave Green, including a 96-minute shift against LAFC in the 2024 Western Conference Semifinals. On the international stage, Baker-Whiting has represented the United States at the U-15, U-19 and U-20 levels, including callups to a pair of U-20 camps in Egypt and Spain earlier this year. He played for one season with Tacoma Defiance in 2020 before signing a First Team contract.

"I've really enjoyed coaching Reed over the past few seasons and watching him grow into a more confident and capable player," said Sounders FC Head Coach Brian Schmetzer. "He's still young, but he carries himself well and continues to show progress every time he steps on the field. This new contract is a good step forward for him, and we're looking forward to seeing how he continues to develop within the group."

Baker-Whiting originally joined the club via the Sounders Discovery Program from Seattle United in 2016 and was on Sounders FC's U-12 squad in 2017 that won the Youdan Trophy after defeating Manchester United, Crystal Palace and Liverpool at the ICC Future's Tournament. He returned to the Youdan Tournament as a member of Sounders FC U-14 team in 2018, defeating Charlton Athletic 5-2 in the final. He also featured for the U-17 squad that won the 2019 Generation adidas Cup Champions Division, defeating Valencia CF in the final.



Seattle Sounders FC, Seattle Reign FC and their charitable partner RAVE Foundation announced on September 12 the clubs' plans to commemorate Latine Heritage Month – an annual recognition that celebrates the diversity of culture and heritage within the Latine community.
