MATCH NOTES

- Seattle Sounders FC travels to face Atlanta United FC on Saturday, July 26 at Mercedes-Benz Stadium (4:30 p.m. PT / Apple TV, 93.3 KJR FM, El Rey 1360 AM).

- The Rave Green come into the fixture following a 3-2 win over the San Jose Earthquakes on Saturday, putting the club in fourth place in the Western Conference with 37 points (10-6-7).

- Atlanta sits in 13th place in the East with 20 points (4-11-8), most recently falling 3-2 to Charlotte FC on Saturday at home.

- Sounders FC and Atlanta have met six times in the regular season since the Georgia side joined MLS in 2017. Seattle trails the series 1-2-3, with the two teams not meeting since 2023.

- Saturday marks the fourth Eastern Conference opponent Sounders FC has faced this year. Seattle drew 2-2 with Charlotte, defeated Nashville SC 3-0 and drew 1-1 with Columbus, with each match being played at home. Following Saturday, the Rave Green travel to Miami and New York City FC to round out their Eastern Conference slate.

- No Western Conference team has more wins or has recorded more points against Eastern Conference sides than Seattle since it joined MLS in 2009, with 76 wins and 265 points.

- Sounders FC midfielder Obed Vargas recently competed in his first MLS All-Star Game this week, helping the MLS team win 3-1 over the Liga MX All-Stars. He also participated in the Skills Challenge, which the MLS side also won.

- Following Saturday's match, Seattle begins its Leagues Cup 2025 campaign with a matchup against Liga MX side and 2025 Concacaf Champions Cup winner Cruz Azul on Thursday, July 31 on the Emerald Queen Casino Pitch at Lumen Field (7:30 p.m. PT / Apple TV, FS1, UniMás, TUDN, El Rey 1360 AM).

SEATTLE-ATLANTA CONNECTIONS

Despite being two of MLS' expansion sides, Seattle and Atlanta have shared a plethora of common ties over the years.

Garth Lagerwey, who was named Atlanta United FC's President & Chief Executive Officer on November 22, 2022, served as Seattle's General Manager & President of Soccer for Seattle from 2015-2022. Lagerwey helped assemble Sounders FC squads that won the 2016 and 2019 MLS Cups, as well as reached the 2017 and 2019 MLS Cup Finals. He also built the 2022 squad that was the first and is still the only team to win the 2022 Concacaf Champions Cup. He helped bring in iconic Sounders players such as midfielder Nicolás Lodeiro, the club's all-competition assist leader, and striker Raúl Ruidíaz, who is second on Seattle's all-time scoring list. Seattle amassed a 117-87-56 MLS regular season record and 17-5-3 postseason record with Lagerwey at the helm. He also helped bolster Sounders FC's academy, producing multiple First Team contributors and winning the Generation Adidas Cup in 2019 and 2022.

Chris Henderson was named Atlanta United FC's Chief Soccer Officer & Sporting Director on December 16, 2024. Henderson was one of the inaugural front office members for Sounders FC when the team joined MLS in 2009, eventually becoming the Vice President of Soccer & Sporting Director during his 12-year tenure with the club. Alongside Lagerwey, the Everett, Washington native helped the club to its 2016 and 2019 MLS Cup titles and four MLS Cup Finals in five years. He also played a major role in helping the Rave Green secure their four Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cups (2009-2011, 2014). Seattle never missed the playoffs with Henderson on staff.

Former Sounders FC player and Assistant Coach Gonzalo Pineda served as Head Coach for Atlanta from 2021-2024, amassing a 34-34-29 record in league play with the Five Stripes over his tenure. Pineda played for Seattle from 2014-2015 and served as an Assistant Coach from 2017-2021, helping the club lift the 2019 MLS Cup as well as reach the 2017 and 2020 MLS Cup finals. He now serves as Head Coach for Liga MX side Atlas.

Furthermore, Osvaldo "Ozzie" Alonso, one of the members of Seattle's inaugural 2009 team, played for Atlanta United FC from 2022-2023. Playing with the team from 2009-2018, Ozzie helped lift one MLS Cup (2016), four U.S. Open Cups (2009-2011, 2014) and four Western Conference champion trophies (2016, 2017, 2019, 2020). He recorded 28 all-competition assists during his time with the club, was a MLS All-Star every year from 2011-2014 and was named to the 2012 MLS Best XI. He left Seattle as the club's all-competition appearance leader, playing in 339 matches for the squad and now sits third all-time.

EASTERN CONFERENCE DOMINANCE

Seattle has had great success against Eastern Conference opponents, amassing 265 points (76-47-37), the most wins and points of any Western Conference team against Eastern Conference foes since joining MLS in 2009.

Prior to Saturday's matchup against Atlanta, the Rave Green drew Charlotte FC 2-2 on February 22, defeated Nashville SC 3-0 on April 19 and drew Columbus 1-1 on July 6, all at home. Following its match against Atlanta, Seattle travels to Miami on September 16 before closing out its Eastern Conference slate in a Decision Day matchup against New York City FC on October 18.

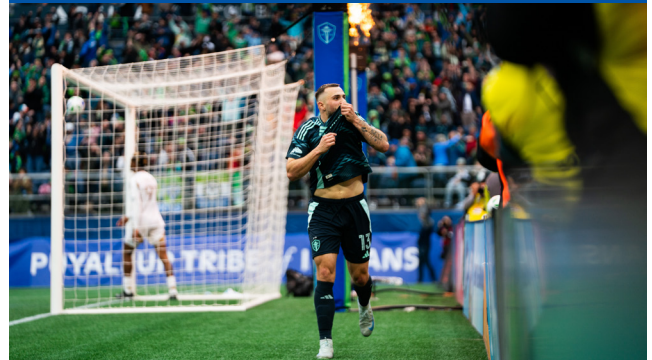

Seattle forward Jordan Morris recorded his 88th all-competition goal against Sporting Kansas City on July 12, extending his lead as Seattle's all-time leading goal scorer. He set the record earlier this year with his goal against LAFC on March 8. His goal against SKC was also his 70th in regular season play, becoming only the second Sounder to accomplish that feat (Raul Ruidiaz).

JESÚS TIES DONOVAN



Jesús Ferreira's goal in first-half stoppage time against Sporting Kansas City on July 12 was good for his 56th regular-season strike since joining MLS in 2017, tying him with Landon Donovan for most goals by a player before the age of 25.

Ferreira was acquired by Seattle via trade from FC Dallas this offseason and has proven to be a valuable member of Seattle's attack. He has provided 10 goal contributions for Seattle this year, including a team-leading eight assists in all competitions.

Prior to joining Seattle, Ferreira was a standout with FC Dallas, tallying 55 goals and 40 assists in all competitions from 2017-2024. He was named MLS Young Player of the Year in 2022 following an 18-goal, six-assist campaign and was also named an MLS All-Star in 2022 and 2023, as well as to the MLS Best XI in 2022.

OBED AT THE 2025 ALL-STAR GAME



Sounders FC midfielder Obed Vargas played in his first-ever MLS All-Star Game earlier this week, helping the MLS team defeat the LIGA MX All-Stars 3-1. He played 29 minutes in the match, subbing on during the second half.

He also participated in the Skills Challenge the day before, a competition that was also won by the MLS players. The Alaska native was paired up with LAFC winger Denis Bouanga for the Two-Touch Challenge, as well as assisted influencer IShowSpeed on various events throughout the night.

Vargas is among the league's most promising young players and a consistent presence in Seattle's midfield. The 19-year-old has started every one of his 18 regular season appearances in 2025, contributing one goal and three assists. Since signing a Homegrown contract prior to the 2022 season, Vargas has already gone on to make 113 all-competition appearances for the club, scoring two goals while adding 15 assists and was named to the 2024 22 Under 22 list, coming in seventh. Vargas appeared in 33 league matches (31 starts) for Seattle last year, including starting three of Sounders FC's postseason matches during its run to the Western Conference Final. Vargas played every minute in all three of Seattle's FIFA Club World Cup 2025™ Group Stage matches this summer, including fixtures against Spanish power Atlético Madrid and 2025 UEFA Champions League winner Paris Saint-Germain.

SOUNDERS FC INJURY UPDATES



João Paulo, Jordan Morris and Paul Rothrock all underwent successful surgeries this week.

João Paulo underwent a right knee partial meniscectomy on Monday. During the procedure, it was discovered that his ACL, previously believed to be torn, is intact and not in need of reconstruction and is expected to return this season.

Morris had surgery to repair a left shoulder AC joint separation he suffered in a match against San Jose on July 19. He is expected to return later this season.

Rothrock had a procedure to repair a fractured third metacarpal bone in his right hand he suffered during training earlier this week. His recovery time is not expected to be long-term.

CRISTIAN NEARS 300 MLS APPEARANCES



Sounders FC veteran midfielder Cristian Roldan is currently sitting on 298 regular-season appearances since joining the club in 2015. He is set to become only the second player - and only field player - in club history to hit 300 regular season appearances, joining goalkeeper Stefan Frei, who has 343 such appearances.

Roldan has played all over the field for the Rave Green during his tenure with the club, most recently finding a successful home in Seattle's defensive midfield. He helped the club win the 2016 and 2019 MLS Cups, as well as the 2022 Concacaf Champions Cup, playing in all eight matches during the tournament's run.

SOUNDERS FC UNVEILS "THE ORCA KIT"



Seattle Sounders FC introduced "The Orca Kit" on July 16, the club's new third kit for the remainder of the 2025 Major League Soccer season. Built in collaboration with adidas and the MLS Archive Collection, this iconic look celebrates the club's storied past and commemorates the Sounders' 1995 A-League championship season. The launch of "The Orca Kit" headlines Sounders FC's first-ever *Throwback Week*, happening this week, as the club turns back the clock and brings a wave of '90s nostalgia to Lumen Field.

A vibrant blend of white, blue and purple, "The Orca Kit" pays homage to the Sounders of the mid-'90s, revived with a modern interpretation. The sleeve design is a reimagining of the hallmark pattern during the early years in the A-League, while the wordmark emblazoned across the front of the jersey is a nod to the club's logo of the era. Sounders FC's modern-day Orca mark stamps the chest in place of the club's current crest, while the official A-League logo resides on the bottom of the kit, subtly bolstering the vintage feel. As part of the MLS Archive Collection, the club is also releasing a new Anthem Jacket and adidas Gazelles in the same color scheme.

"The Orca Kit is more than just a jersey – it's a celebration of who we are and where we've come from," said Sounders FC President of Business Operations Hugh Weber. "This design honors a pivotal moment in our club's history, when the Sounders returned to professional soccer and reignited the passion for the game in Seattle. By blending iconic elements from the '90s with a modern edge, we're not only paying tribute to the trailblazers who laid our foundation, but also inspiring the next generation to own our archive and write the next chapter of greatness. We're grateful to adidas and Major League Soccer for their vision and partnership in bringing the *Archive Collection* to life, helping us tell this story in such an authentic and impactful way."

"The Orca Kit" showcases the official Puyallup Tribe Salmon logo design on the right sleeve, honoring the vital importance of salmon to the culture, sustenance and livelihood of Coast Salish peoples. This design reflects the Puyallup Tribe's profound stewardship of the land and waters, where salmon are a sacred and central part of their heritage. An original steward of the land throughout what is now known as the Puget Sound, the Puyallup Tribe and its Emerald Queen Casino have partnered with Sounders FC since 2021. The left jersey sleeve carries the Apple TV logo as Major League Soccer's broadcast partner.

"This kit represents the connection between the salmon and orca. We're honored to share how these species are intertwined in both our ecosystem and our identity," said the Puyallup Tribal Council, the Tribe's governing body. "Together, they tell a story of resilience and our commitment to protecting the waters that have nourished our people for generations."

Debuting last year, the MLS Archive Collection is back this season with new third kits for 10 MLS clubs, styled with a matching jacket and Gazelle shoes. Drawing on the nostalgic look of sports broadcasting, advertising, magazines and catalogs, the adidas and MLS collaboration combines different visual languages to create a unique narrative for each club. This year's collection spans coast-to-coast, bringing back some of the most iconic logos and patterns in MLS history, combined with bright bold designs that were popularized during the '90s. In addition to Sounders FC, the other clubs featured in this year's collection are Charlotte FC, Colorado Rapids, Columbus Crew, D.C. United, FC Dallas, Minnesota United, Nashville SC, New England Revolution and San Jose Earthquakes.

A transformative period for the club and region, Seattle emerged as a hub of culture and technology in the '90s, defined by an iconic music scene, legendary athletes and the boom of local businesses. "The Orca Kit" is a tribute to a time where the trailblazing of the Pacific Northwest went global. It borrows from the past in celebration of a bright future.

After sunseting in 1983 as part of the NASL, the Seattle Sounders made their triumphant return to pro soccer the same year the world's game descended on America with the 1994 FIFA World Cup, winning back-to-back A-League titles in 1995 and 1996. Alumni from the 1995 squad are returning to Seattle for a special recognition at Sounders FC's match vs. San Jose on Saturday, July 19 (5:30 p.m. PT / Apple TV, 93.3 KJR FM, El Rey 1360 AM), commemorating the 30th anniversary of the club's first league championship. Led by current Sounders FC Director of Player Development Wade Webber, goalkeeper Marcus Hahnemann, league MVP Peter Hattrup and local legend Chance Fry, the Sounders finished the 1995 regular season tied for first in points, defeating the Vancouver 86ers and Atlanta Ruckus in the postseason to capture the A-League title.

Additionally, team promotions, player audio drops and studio-produced promotional content will provide a steady drumbeat alongside match coverage and shoulder programming.

This landmark collaboration, designating FOX 13 Seattle as the Official Flagship Local Broadcast Partner of both Sounders FC and Reign FC, underscores the combined strength and growing impact of men's and women's professional soccer. It represents a major step forward in providing fans expansive and inclusive coverage, celebrating Seattle's rich soccer tradition on a shared stage.

Effective immediately, the first Reign FC contest on FOX 13's air kicks off on Friday, May 2 live from Lumen Field, as the home side takes on the Kansas City Current at 7:30 p.m. PT. For Sounders FC, the partnership includes a diverse array of shoulder programming, news and sports coverage, in addition to in-season specials and features throughout the year. Live Sounders FC matches continue to air on MLS Season Pass on Apple TV.
