**Bruce Arena**

**On initial reflections from beating and drawing with Vancouver Whitecaps FC over two matches:**

“The good thing is we got points in both games, and especially against Vancouver, who we’re battling with right now the top of the table. We didn’t lose any ground to them. But you know, again, it’s a long season. We’re not going to spend a whole lot of time on what happened over the last two games.”

**On how the team handled Vancouver’s physicality of the match:**

“I think our back line held up well, physically. I thought [Benji] Kikanović was very good, but I think their back line and their midfield did a real good job. As I said, they gave a very good impression—winning second balls and being a little bit more aggressive. Give Vancouver a lot of credit. They’re a team that made it to the [Audi] MLS [Cup] final last year. So, we’ve gotten four points off them in two games.”

**On the team’s strong buy-in and unity this season:**

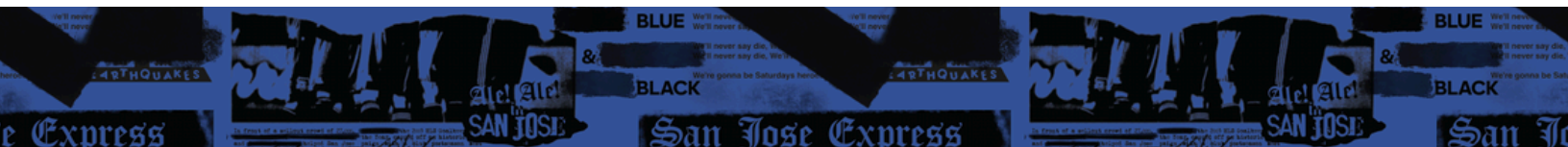
“Communication was going to be a huge component in this game, and I think we did a good job overall picking up players in our space. Vancouver moves around well and makes it tough on you, but I thought we handled it really well. I also want to shout out Benji [Kikanović] for the game he had. He was rock-solid on the right side, and they kept trying to play balls in behind, but he dealt with everything. I think the whole back line did a great job defending in our box. Daniel was rock solid, Rony [Vieira] did great in front of us, and even the front guys worked their butts off. Really proud of the group.”

**On the back line’s chemistry and what makes the group difficult for opposing attackers to play against:**

“We’ve got a lot of speed back there, and it’s a group that’s been playing together all year now, starting in preseason. I think we’ve shown all year what we’re capable of. We’ve also got one of the best goalkeepers in the league, and that’s huge for us. We’ve got each other’s backs, and we’ve shown that all year. If someone makes a mistake, the next man steps up and provides cover.”

**On the team’s selflessness:**

“Our team has no egos. We’re just a really fun squad, and the locker room has great vibes every day. We’ve got good banter, and that starts with the coaches creating a positive environment. I think Bruce has a great eye for talent, and he’s done a great job in his second year. We’ve got a group of guys who don’t care who scores or who gets the credit, we just want to go out there and win. It’s a great group, and honestly a joy to be around every single day. Hopefully we can keep the success going.”

## 2026 TEAM OF THE MATCHDAY HONOREES



San Jose Earthquakes goalkeeper Daniel has been named to Major League Soccer's Team of the Matchday for Matchday 12. A standout moment came in the 57th minute, when Daniel produced two back-to-back saves to deny Vancouver's Bruno Caicedo and Jeevan Badwal. Although Vancouver leveled late to end the match at 1-1, Daniel was instrumental in securing the point at home, facing 17 total shots on goal and preserving the scoreline for the final quarter-hour of the match. This is the second MLS Team of the Matchday recognition for Daniel this season and ninth in his career.

## MLS PLAYER OF THE MONTH HONOREES



**April: Timo Werner**

San Jose Earthquakes forward Timo Werner was voted the MLS Player of the Month for April 2026. In April, Werner finished tied for the MLS lead with seven goal contributions (four goals, three assists) and pulled the strings for an Earthquakes squad that went 5-0-0 with a league-best +13 goal differential. From April 19 to April 25, Werner became the first player in club history to produce three straight games with at least one goal and one assist.

Since joining San Jose in the Primary Transfer Window, Werner has four goals and five assists in just 455 minutes of regular-season action. Among players with at least nine goal contributions this season, only Nashville SC's Sam Surridge (440) has played in fewer minutes than Werner. His nine goal contributions are also tied for the most by a player in their first MLS season (Houston Dynamo FC's Guilherme).

## Storylines

- LOOKING TO GET EVEN:** San Jose is 9-1-2 (27 GF, 8 GA) in MLS play and alone in first in both the Western Conference and Supporters' Shield standings for the first time since 2012. The Black and Blue take on Seattle Sounders FC for the second time this season, with Seattle being the only team to defeat San Jose in 2026. Seattle won 1-0 at PayPal Park back on March 15, despite San Jose outshooting Seattle 24-7 overall and 8-4 in shots on goal. This matchup features two of the only four MLS teams to not surrender double-digit goals this season. Additionally, it's a showdown between coaching greats, with San Jose's Bruce Arena (all-time MLS leader in wins with 282) and Brian Schmetzer (ninth overall at 147) facing off.
- BEST START EVER:** The Quakes' 9-1-2 start is the best in club history, dating back to its inception in 1974, eclipsing the start in 2012 (7-2-3), which ended in SJ capturing the Supporters' Shield. San Jose won 9 of its first 10 MLS matches to open the season, the first time in the post-shootout era that a MLS team has done so. San Jose already sits on 29 points in the second week of May—something that didn't occur until July of last season. With just two more wins, they would already match the 2025 campaign's total of 11.
- WE'RE GOING STREAKING:** The Earthquakes are enjoying an eight-game unbeaten streak in the league and 10-game undefeated run across all competitions.
- ROAD WARRIORS:** The Quakes are tied with the 2022 Red Bull NY team for the best six-game road start in MLS history (5-0-1), so a win Wednesday would break the record. However, the last time the Sounders lost a match at Lumen Field was against the European champions Paris Saint-Germain during the FIFA Club World Cup in June 2025.
- GRASS AT LUMEN:** The teams will not be playing on Lumen Field's usual turf, but instead, a layer of hybrid grass has been installed on top of it in time for this summer's FIFA World Cup. The new playing surface is a mix of real grass woven with artificial fiber. The Seattle Times reported there will be about 12-14 inches of sand and other base materials between the new grass and the turf.
- NEVER SAY DIE:** The Quakes have erased a one-goal deficit in four of its last five games across all competitions (April 22: Down 1-0 vs. Austin FC and won 5-1; April 25: Down 2-1 vs. St. Louis CITY SC and won 3-2; April 28: Down 2-1 vs. Minnesota United FC in the Lamar U.S. Open Cup Rd. of 16 and won 4-2; May 2: Down 1-0 vs. Toronto FC and drew 1-1).
- RECENT HISTORY:** San Jose has drawn in two of their last four matches overall against Seattle and are looking for their first win in the series since March 23, 2024, a 3-2 win at PayPal Park. However, when it comes to Lumen Field, the Quakes have earned points in four of their last five trips and gone 2-2-1 (2021: W, 1-0; 2022: D, 2-2; 2023: W, 1-0; 2024: D, 2-2; 2025: L, 3-2).
  - Daniel set the SJ-SEA series record for saves in one game with nine last season (3/29/25). Paul Marie has faced the Rave Green the most (11 games, 6 starts, 1 goal).
- YOU SHALL NOT PASS:** San Jose is just one of four teams to not allow double-digit goals in a game this season (Seattle, Nashville, Vancouver) and are fourth overall in goals conceded (8).
  - SJ remains the only team in MLS to not concede a single goal from a set piece (0).
  - Goalkeeper Daniel is on fire. He has earned five clean sheets and is tied for second in MLS. His goals against average is a gaudy 0.67 and his save percentage is fourth in MLS at (77.1%).
  - Speed demons: Daniel Munie is tied for second in terms top speed among all MLS players at 22.36 mph, with Jamar Ricketts right behind him in fifth at 22.34 mph. Munie's speed is the fastest among center backs in the league. Ricketts' and Munie's figures also make them among the fastest defenders in MLS. Peyton Miller of NE holds the fastest speed this season (22.76 mph).
- AN EPICENTER OF OFFENSE:** 6 different Quakes have 2+ goals (Preston Judd, Niko Tsakiris, Ousseni Bouda, Daniel Munie, Jack Skahan, Timo Werner) while 8 different Quakes have 2+ assists (Bouda, Beau Leroux, Judd, Paul Marie, Munie, Jamar Ricketts, Tsakiris, Werner).

## Connections

- HERITAGE CUP:** This Western Conference rivalry actually began in 1974, when both clubs joined the North America Soccer League (NASL) as expansion teams. The Heritage Cup is a nod to that history, with aggregate score deciding it followed by the tiebreaker of away goals, and then table position. Seattle leads after winning the first leg on March 15, 1-0.
- BACK TO THE PNW:** Quakes MLS Cup champ and current Head Scout Ian Russell is a native of West Seattle. SJ goalkeeper Earl Edwards Jr. played for the Seattle Sounders U-23 team back in 2018.
- FROM SJ TO SEA:** Sounders forward Danny Musovski was drafted by SJ in 2018 and played that one season. SEA forward Osaze De Rosario's father is Quakes MLS Cup champ Dwayne De Rosario.

# ONGOING SEASON STORYLINES

## The Bruce Bump: Year 2 Track Record

Bruce Arena is the most accomplished coach in American soccer history, but a closer look at his resume at MLS level reveals a terrifying trend for his opponents once he has a full year to lay his foundation:

- **D.C. United (1997):** After building the team from scratch and winning the inaugural MLS Cup presented by Audi in 1996, Arena's second season cemented a dynasty. D.C. United captured the Supporters' Shield and went back-to-back to win the 1997 MLS Cup.
- **Red Bull New York (2007):** Arena only coached one full season after joining New York midway through 2006, but he still steered the team to the 2007 Playoffs if we consider that "Year 2".
- **LA Galaxy (2010):** After taking the helm in late 2008 and reaching the final in his first full year, Arena's second full season in 2010 resulted in a Supporters' Shield, laying the groundwork for the Galaxy's back-to-back MLS Cup run.
- **New England Revolution (2021):** Arena arrived in Foxborough in mid-2019. By 2021—his second full season in charge—he orchestrated a historic campaign, capturing the Supporters' Shield while shattering the MLS single-season points record (73 points).

## Timo Time in San Jose

The Earthquakes acquired German international Timo Werner from German Bundesliga side Red Bull Leipzig on a permanent transfer in the offseason and signed him to a Designated Player contract through June 2028. Werner comes to Major League Soccer as the biggest signing in Earthquakes history following a distinguished career that includes a UEFA Champions League title and a parade of trophies at every level, compiling 154 goals across all competitions over an illustrious career in the Bundesliga and English Premier League representing RB Leipzig (over three occasions), Tottenham Hotspur, Chelsea FC and VfB Stuttgart.

A multifaceted attacker known as "Turbo Timo" for his pace and ability to accelerate, he has vast experience playing both wing positions, as a second striker and up front at center forward. In addition to being a prolific scorer and clinical finisher, Werner has displayed a proclivity to create chances for his teammates, as evidenced by his 54 career assists in league play alone.

## Belief in the American Player

It's only fitting that the most decorated coach in American soccer history has put together a team that leads the league in domestic players. **No team in MLS has more college players on the roster (19) or averaged more American players in the starting 11 more in 2026 than Bruce Arena's Earthquakes (7.8).**

## The Fastest Back Line in the League

The Quakes achieved their first 3-0-0 start since starting MLS play in 1996, opening with clean sheets over Sporting Kansas City, Atlanta United FC and the Philadelphia Union. With three straight shutouts, the Quakes were just one game away from tying the club record of four consecutive set in August 2015. They have since recorded two more in the following three games to match the clean sheet total of all last season (5).

A big key to that success has been the back line, starting with the center back pairing of former SuperDraft first-round selections Daniel Munie (2023) and local pick Reid Roberts out of the Univ. of San Francisco (2025). Converted forwards Jamar Ricketts (2024 Rd. 1) on the left (who replaced DeJuan Jones after an unfortunate Achilles injury) and Benji Kikanović (signed out of college) on the right round out this speedy foursome. **Munie (22.36 mph) and Ricketts (22.34 mph) are among the top three defenders in MLS when it comes to top speed.**

## Daniel the Protector Back in Form

Daniel, often considered one of the elite goalkeepers in MLS when healthy, has returned to form in 2026. His shot-stopping at key moments is a big part of the Quakes' 9-1-2 start with five clean sheets. Daniel's second-half save against Sporting Kansas City in the Feb. 21 season opener had a post-shot expected goals figure of 0.85 per Fotmob, a club record.

**In the first 12 league games, the Brazilian has only conceded eight times. His goals against average stands at just 0.67.**

## A Coming-of-Age Core

While Timo Werner's debut has garnered the lion's share of headlines, the attacking core around him has produced to fuel the Quakes' hot start. Werner's first three assists were to former SuperDraft first-round pick **Ouseni Bouda** out of Stanford (five goals), while **Preston Judd** leads SJ with a career-high eight goals in the early going as well. Another SuperDraft first-round pick, **Jamar Ricketts**, also had two assists in the first three matches, which signifies San Jose's belief in domestic players, but also their ability to perform in MLS. **Reid Roberts**, a SuperDraft first-rounder pick out of USF, has worked himself into a stabilizing presence in the Starting XI and earned Team of the Matchday honors on May 4 after making one of the defensive plays of the year to secure a 1-1 draw in Toronto.

## Academy Alumni in the Midfield

While captain Ronaldo Vieira is the enforcer in defensive midfield, he partners with a pair of local boys with origins in the Quakes Academy. **Niko Tsakiris from nearby Saratoga and Beau Leroux from San Jose both played in the Earthquakes' youth system before making it to the first team.** Tsakiris has started the season in central attacking midfield with seven assists and Leroux, a box-to-box midfielder and San Jose State University alum, has one goal and four assists so far in 2026 league play. However, Tsakiris underwent groin surgery May 12 and is expected to be out 3-4 months.

## Investments in Infrastructure

Since Bruce Arena's arrival as Head Coach/Sporting Director, ownership's investment in the club's infrastructure in and around PayPal Park to stay competitive in a burgeoning league has been readily apparent.

**In the stadium, the club committed \$1 million** during the offseason toward a revamped Habbas Law Epicenter, the fan zone behind the North End scoreboard, which includes new furniture/decor/activations as well as the Longest Outdoor Bar in North America and the new Rank+Rally Team Store, which has quadrupled in size. This renovation comes off the heels of the installment of 11 KS28 high-powered dual subwoofers by L-Acoustics, along with a brand-new DJ Booth last year. The Bermudagrass playing surface is also brand new for 2026.

**The upgrades have extended to the area outside the stadium, too.** The club added a second Bermudagrass field to the adjacent Training Facility, and across the street from PayPal Park, there is a new coach's office, conference room, video meeting room, players' lounge and dining hall.

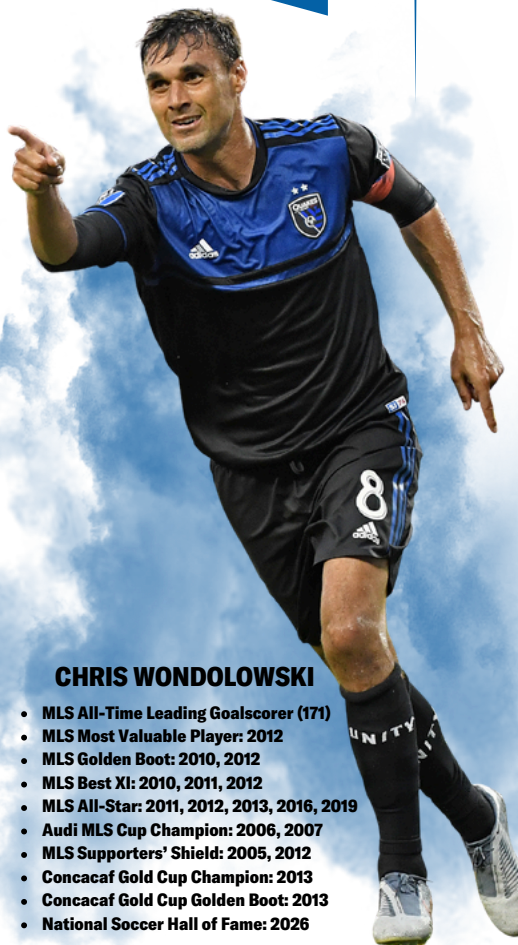

# QUAKES FOUNDATION COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS



## One Ball Can Change a Life

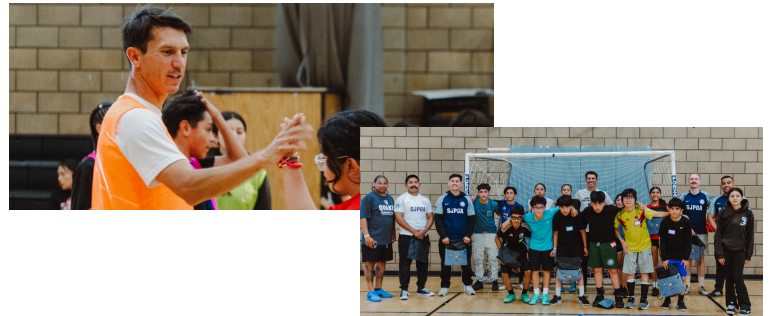
For over 50 years, the Earthquakes have witnessed firsthand the power of soccer to change lives through a variety of ways, like building individual character and creativity, fostering collective values like teamwork, offering safe spaces to play and dream, and even opening doors to new worlds. To turn this vision into action, the club will donate 15,000 soccer balls to the community this year in support of transformational Quakes Foundation programming, which includes school visits, the club's growing Saturday Night Lights futsal program, youth tournaments, clinics, camps and other events throughout Northern California.

"Our work in local communities shows us every day the lasting impact a soccer ball can have on a young life in helping to both create positive outcomes and helping steer kids away from negative ones," said Earthquakes VP of Community Relations Robert Davis. "That is why every soccer ball matters; one ball can literally make an incredible difference."

## Saturday Night Lights presented by CalHOPE

A new program under the Quakes Foundation, launched in April, was Saturday Night Lights presented by CalHOPE. This was a 10-week pilot offering free, safe futsal nights for youth in underserved San Jose neighborhoods. The program was hosted at two sites, including LeyVa Middle School and Washington United Youth Center. The program combined soccer, mentorship, food, and mental health support to create a trusted space on weekend nights.

The impact was real: 100% of LeyVa participants were promoted to high school (including several at-risk students), with zero disciplinary incidents and increased school attendance. Families reported stronger connections, better behavior at home, and more positive views of law enforcement.



## 52K Meals

in partnership with the PG&E Foundation

For the 2026 season, the Quakes Foundation and the PG&E Corporation Foundation continued their partnership to address the growing issue of food insecurity in the Bay Area and its surrounding areas.

Through the 52,000 Meals program, the Quakes Foundation awarded monetary grants to 12 impactful nonprofits in East SJ, Gilroy, Watsonville, Salinas, E. Palo Alto and Merced.

## Get EQ Fit presented by El Camino Health

Get Earthquakes Fit, presented by El Camino Health, is a five-week health and fitness program designed for third and fourth-grade students. The program features 10 interactive games that promote physical activity while reinforcing healthy nutrition habits. Designed to be simple and turnkey for educators, the curriculum requires minimal preparation while remaining fun, engaging, and educational for students.

The program concluded with closing ceremonies at each participating school, celebrating student achievements with special appearances from Earthquakes players.



## Quakes Unified

The Quakes Unified Special Olympics soccer team integrates individuals with intellectual disabilities (Special Olympics athletes) and individuals without intellectual disabilities (Unified player partners) to compete together on one team. Quakes Unified conducts regular training sessions and participates in competition against other MLS Unified teams.

On July 19, the Quakes Unified Special Olympics team traveled to Los Angeles for its first major road trip. The inaugural Unified California Clásico, hosted by LAFC, featured Unified teams representing the San Jose Earthquakes, LA Galaxy, LAFC, and Sacramento Republic FC. Quakes Unified concluded the tournament with a second-place finish.





## COACHING STAFF

**Dave Sarachan** comes to San Jose as an accomplished leader in his own right, having won the MLS Coach of the Year award (2003), the Supporters' Shield (2003) and the U.S. Open Cup twice (2003, 2006) as head coach of Chicago Fire FC from 2002-07. Most recently, he was an assistant coach for Maccabi Tel Aviv, winning the Israeli Premier League and qualifying for the UEFA Champions League in his lone season with the Yellows (2023-24). Sarachan joins Arena for the sixth time, having previously served as an assistant coach on his staff at club level with the Galaxy (2008-16) and D.C. United (1997-99), as well as for two different eras on the U.S. Men's National Team (1999-2002, 2017) and the University of Virginia (1984-87). Alongside Arena, Sarachan has won four MLS Cups (1998, 2011, 2012, 2014), two Supporters' Shields (2010, 2011), one Concacaf Champions Cup (1998), one Copa Interamericana (1998) and two Concacaf Gold Cups (2002, 2017). During that second spell with the USMNT, Sarachan succeeded Arena as interim head coach (2017-18). A native of Rochester, N.Y., Sarachan possesses further head coaching experience with the Puerto Rico national team (2021-22), North Carolina FC in USL Championship (2018-20) and collegiately at Cornell University (1988-97).



**Shalrie Joseph** joins Arena for the second time after serving as his assistant coach in New England (2022-23) and as an assistant for the club's Supporters' Shield-winning campaign in 2021 while coaching various age groups in the Revolution Academy (2020-22). A native of Grenada who earned 20 caps and scored one goal with them as a player, Joseph took the helm as head coach of his national team from 2018-19. He eventually led The Spice Boys toward qualification for the 2021 Concacaf Gold Cup and promotion to League A in the 2019-20 Concacaf Nations League. As a standout midfielder who played 13 MLS seasons (2003-15)—11 with the Revs—Joseph was selected eight consecutive times for the MLS All-Star Game (2004-11) and received four MLS Best XI nods (2005, 2007-09). In N.E., he was teammates with current Quakes assistants Steve Ralston and Adin Brown, with the full trio overlapping from 2003-04. Joseph, a St. John's University alum, ended up playing in three MLS Cup finals (2005-07) for the Revs, capturing the North American SuperLiga in 2008 as well as the U.S. Open Cup in 2007.



**Steve Ralston** originally joined the Earthquakes as an assistant coach in 2015 after four years in the same capacity with Houston Dynamo FC. He took over as interim head coach of the Quakes for the final six games of 2018. After three years away, he returned to San Jose as an interim assistant coach in 2022. A native of St. Louis and Florida International University alumnus, Ralston retired from MLS in 2010 as the league's all-time leader in assists (135), games played (378), starts (372), and minutes (33,143). He scored 76 goals over 13 MLS seasons and played in four MLS Cup finals for New England, serving as captain (2007-09) and winning the North American SuperLiga in 2008 and the U.S. Open Cup in 2007. Ralston was named an MLS All-Star seven times and received MLS Best XI recognition three times (1999, 2000, 2002). At international level, he earned 36 caps for the U.S. (1997-2007) and scored four goals, winning the 2007 Concacaf Gold Cup.



**Adin Brown** returns to the Earthquakes as goalkeeper coach. Brown most recently served as goalkeeper coach for Chicago Fire FC (2020-22). Prior to joining Chicago, Brown was goalkeeper coach for the Portland Timbers (2015-17) and Timbers2 (2018-19), helping the club win its first MLS Cup in 2015. He also served in the same role for the University of Portland (2013-15). Brown, a native of Pleasant Hill, California, and graduate of De La Salle High School, attended the College of William & Mary and was just the third goalkeeper in NCAA history to be named a First-Team All-American twice. The third overall pick in the 2000 MLS SuperDraft, Brown appeared 85 times over seven seasons, making his mark with New England (2002-04) where he posted a 1.42 goals against average over three years and had the Revs on the brink of winning the 2002 MLS Cup. He also played abroad for Aalesund FK (2005-09), helping lead them to the Norwegian top tier in 2007. Internationally, Brown was the U.S. starting keeper throughout qualification for the 2000 Summer Olympics but missed the final competition due to injury.

# HEADLINER KIT

The Headliner Kit tells the Earthquakes' story through the cultural and aesthetic lens of the legendary Bay Area punk rock scene. Created by adidas in partnership with punk icon Lars Frederiksen, the jersey features the club's traditional black and blue hues with a striking red accent around the collar and El Camino Health, the Quakes' new Official Jersey Partner, prominently displayed on the chest. Emblazoned on the kit is a chaotic flyer collage design with a mish-mash of fonts, handwritten elements and tags, distorted bitmap illustrations, as well as other elements of the chip-on-your-shoulder attitude that defines both the Bay Area and the Earthquakes. Amid the maelstrom of headlines, imagery and iconography from the club's 52-year history on the front of the jersey, the crest area features lyrics from the Quakes' official anthem, "Never Say Die," which was written by Frederiksen, known for his work with renowned punk bands like Rancid and The Old Firm Casuals. Finally, the "Soccer for the People" jock tag calls out the most important connection: the undying one between the Quakes and their community.



# THE DEAD KIT

In honor of the Grateful Dead's recent 60th Anniversary, the Earthquakes are rocking The Dead Kit. One of the most iconic bands to ever hail from the Bay Area, the Grateful Dead's uncanny influence on the psychedelic music scene and the region's revolutionary spirit has rippled through time. As a tribute to six decades of counter-culture and creativity, the Earthquakes are proud to partner with them and adidas on a jersey emblematic of an ethos that still thrives today. On Dec. 4, 1965, the Grateful Dead performed for the very first time under that name at an "Acid Test" party in the heart of San Jose at a Victorian house on South Fifth Street, where the Janet Gray Hayes Rotunda at City Hall currently stands.

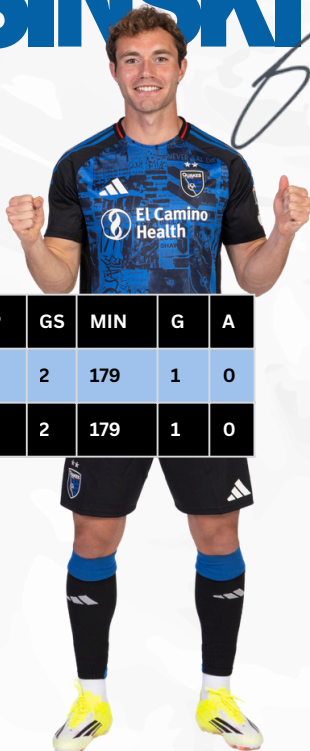
