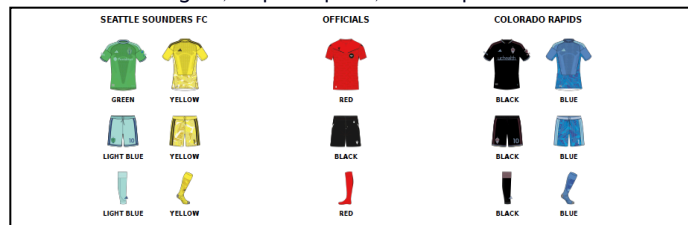

MATCH NOTES

• Seattle Sounders FC kicks off its 2026 MLS season with a match against the Colorado Rapids on Sunday, February 22 on the Emerald Queen Casino Pitch at Lumen Field (6:15 p.m. PT / Apple TV, FS1, 93.3 KJR FM, El Rey 1360 AM).

• The Rave Green finished the 2025 MLS season in fifth place in the Western Conference last season with 55 points (15-9-10), losing to Minnesota United FC in Round One of the MLS Cup Playoffs.

• Seattle became the first team to win all five annual North American trophies last season when it captured the Leagues Cup 2025 title, defeating Inter Miami 3-0 in front of nearly 70,000 fans at Lumen Field.

• Sounders FC transferred midfielder Obed Vargas to Atlético Madrid earlier this month. The 20-year-old appeared in 130 matches during his time with Seattle, including 41 appearances last year. The Alaska native was named to the number one spot on the 22 *Under 22* list last year, the league's ranking of the top young talent.

• The club also traded midfielder Reed Baker-Whiting to Nashville SC earlier this week for up to \$1.1 million in cash, as well as a sell-on fee.

• The Rave Green bolstered their roster this offseason, including signing free agent midfielder and Federal Way native Hassani Dotson, who made 176 appearances and scored 18 goals in all competitions for Minnesota United FC from 2019-2025.

• Sounders FC hired Ricardo Clark as its newest Assistant Coach. Clark was previously with the Vancouver Whitecaps FC organization, most recently serving as the Whitecaps FC 2 Head Coach.

• Seattle only lost one match at home in the regular season last year, compiling a 10-1-6 record. Sounders FC's lifetime 68.88% home winning percentage in the regular season is third among all teams in MLS history.

• Following Sunday's match, the Rave Green embark on a five-match road stretch, beginning with a fixture at Real Salt Lake on Saturday, February 28 at America First Field (4:30 p.m. PT / Apple TV, iHeartMedia Seattle, El Rey 1360 AM).

SFC TRANSFERS VARGAS TO ATLÉTICO MADRID



Sounders FC announced on February 2 that it has reached an agreement to transfer midfielder Obed Vargas to La Liga side Atlético Madrid prior to the close of the Winter Transfer Window. After originally joining Sounders FC's Academy in 2019, the 20-year-old Alaska native has spent the last five-plus seasons with the First Team, making 130 all-competition appearances with eight goals and 16 assists, helping the Rave Green win the 2022 Concacaf Champions Cup and Leagues Cup 2025. Vargas makes the jump to the Spanish topflight after a 2025 campaign in which he tallied six goals and seven assists in 41 appearances across all competitions, earning the top spot on MLS' annual 22 Under 22 list and an All-Star selection. Full terms of the deal are not being made public, but in addition to an undisclosed transfer fee, Sounders FC retains a sell-on percentage in the event of a future move.

The Anchorage, Alaska native joined Sounders FC Academy from Cook Inlet Soccer Club in 2019 at the age of 14 before signing with Tacoma Defiance two years later. He made his MLS debut later that year at Austin FC via Extreme Hardship on July 22, 2021, at the time becoming the third-youngest player in league history to play in an MLS match (15 years, 351 days). After officially signing with the First Team as the club's 18th Homegrown Player in December 2021, Vargas made his home debut against Honduran club Motagua on February 24, 2022 in Concacaf Champions Cup play. He made seven appearances in the tournament, including as a substitute in the second leg of the Final against Pumas UNAM, helping secure a 5-2 aggregate victory as Seattle became the first MLS team to win the continental tournament.

After starting 24 of 35 regular-season appearances over his first two seasons in MLS, Vargas set career highs in appearances (30), minutes (2,542) and assists (seven) in 2024, cementing his place as a starter in Seattle's midfield alongside Cristian Roldan. He went on to start all 26 of his league appearances in 2025, recording three goals and five assists, in addition to a brace in Sounders FC's postseason home win over Minnesota United. Outside of MLS play, Vargas started all six of Seattle's Leagues Cup 2025 fixtures, helping the club win the tournament with a 3-0 victory over Inter Miami CF in front of nearly 70,000 fans at Lumen Field. He also played in all three of Seattle's 2025 FIFA Club World Cup matches last summer, including a 90-minute shift against Atlético Madrid.

Sounders FC faced Atlético Madrid in last summer's FIFA Club World Cup, with the Spanish side earning a 3-1 victory on the Emerald Queen Casino Pitch at Lumen Field. Albert Rusnák scored the lone goal for Seattle in the Group Stage match. Atlético was Vargas' favorite club growing up as a child, routinely watching their matches from Alaska starting at the age of 10. Following the Club World Cup contest, Vargas exchanged jerseys with Antoine Griezmann, his favorite player from his youth.

On the international stage, Vargas has three senior appearances for the Mexico National Team, most recently joining the squad earlier this month for a pair of friendlies, as well as 10 combined appearances at the U-20 and U-23 levels. Vargas represented Mexico last year at the 2025 FIFA U-20 World Cup in Chile, making five appearances during the team's run to the quarterfinals. He made his debut for El Tri's senior squad against the United States in a 2-0 victory on October 15, 2024. Vargas originally represented the United States at the U-15, U-20 and U-23 levels before utilizing his one-time federation switch to Mexico.

SFC TRADES BAKER-WHITING TO NASHVILLE



Sounders FC announced on Wednesday it has traded midfielder Reed Baker-Whiting to Nashville SC in exchange for \$800,000 in a cash-for-player trade. Seattle could receive up to an additional \$300,000 if certain performance metrics are met, in addition to retaining a percentage of a future trade or transfer. Originally joining Sounders FC Academy in 2016, Baker-Whiting played at every level of the club's developmental pathway, eventually signing with the First Team in 2021 and appearing in 79 all-competition matches over five seasons. The 20-year-old has represented the U.S. Men's Youth National Team at various levels since 2019, most recently appearing in four matches at the 2025 FIFA U-20 World Cup in Chile.

"Reed is a great example of the strength of our player development pathway and what's possible for young players who come through our system," said Sounders FC General Manager & Chief Soccer Officer Craig Waibel. "He's worked hard, represented this club the right way and made meaningful contributions during his time in Seattle. We're grateful for everything he's given to the Sounders and the commitment he's shown every day. At the same time, we're excited for him as he takes on this new opportunity in Nashville and we wish him nothing but success in the next chapter of his career."

Baker-Whiting, 20, is coming off a 2025 season where he made 19 appearances (nine starts), tallying an assist against Sporting Kansas City in regular-season play (August 24). He started two of his three appearances in Leagues Cup 2025 action, including a 90-minute shift in the Final against Inter Miami CF opposite Lionel Messi, helping the club win the tournament with a 3-0 victory in front of nearly 70,000 fans on the Emerald Queen Casino Pitch at Lumen Field. He also appeared in two of Seattle's three 2025 FIFA Club World Cup matches this summer, playing all 90 minutes against Atlético Madrid.

He scored his lone goal with Sounders FC in the 2023 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup against the San Diego Loyal, helping the team to an extra-time victory. The Seattle native has appeared in four career postseason matches for the Rave Green, including a 90-minute shift against LAFC in the 2024 Western Conference Semifinals.

"Reed has grown a lot since signing with the First Team and that development showed every time he stepped on the field," said Sounders FC Head Coach Brian Schmetz. "He brought energy, athleticism and a willingness to learn that helped him continue to improve year after year. We appreciate the work he put in for this club and the professionalism he showed throughout his time here. We're excited for him as he takes this next step and we wish him the best in Nashville."

On the international stage, the midfielder has 19 appearances for the USMYNT at the U-15, U-19, U-20 and U-23 levels. Baker-Whiting represented the Stars and Stripes last year at the 2025 FIFA U-20 World Cup in Chile, making four appearances during the team's run to the quarterfinals.

Baker-Whiting originally joined the club via the Sounders Discovery Program from Seattle United in 2016 and was on Sounders FC's U-12 squad in 2017 that won the Youdan Trophy after defeating Manchester United, Crystal Palace and Liverpool at the ICC Futures Tournament. He returned to the Youdan Tournament as a member of the Sounders FC U-14 team in 2018, defeating Charlton Athletic 5-2 in the final. He also featured for the U-17 squad that won the 2019 Generation adidas Cup Champions Division, defeating Valencia CF in the final. He then signed with Tacoma Defiance in 2020, making eight appearances before signing with the First Team in 2021.

DOMINANCE AT LUMEN FIELD



The Rave Green only lost once at Lumen Field in MLS play last year, compiling a 10-1-6 record. 2025 Supporters' Shield-winning Philadelphia Union were the only other team in MLS with one loss at home last season.

Seattle has a 68.77% home winning percentage in the regular season since it joined the league in 2009, third among all teams in MLS history (including the now-defunct Chivas USA, Miami Fusion and Tampa Bay Mutiny). That number trails only LAFC (74.23%) and NYCFC (68.99%), though the Rave Green have played nearly 100 more home matches than either team.

COMING OFF A HISTORIC SEASON



Seattle played 50 matches in all competitions last year, the most the club has played in a single season. It compiled a 23-13-14 record over the course of the season, scoring 90 goals, a single-season record.

Outside of the regular season, the Rave Green played in the 2025 Concacaf Champions Cup, Leagues Cup 2025, 2025 FIFA Club World Cup and MLS Cup Playoffs, winning the Leagues Cup 2025 title with a 3-0 win over Inter Miami in the final in front of 70,000 fans at Lumen Field.

THE RAVE GREEN ADD HASSANI DOTSON



Sounders FC announced in December 16 that it has signed free agent midfielder Hassani Dotson to a contract through the 2027-2028 season, with a club option for 2028-2029. The Federal Way, Washington native has spent his entire seven-year MLS career with Minnesota United FC, making 176 appearances and scoring 18 goals in all competitions.

“Hassani has shown a high level of quality during his years in MLS,” said Sounders FC General Manager & Chief Soccer Officer Craig Waibel. “His versatility, competitiveness and willingness to do the hard work make him an ideal fit for our group. We’re excited to welcome Hassani to the club and confident he will contribute to the success of the team.”

Dotson, 28, was drafted by Minnesota in the First Round of the 2019 MLS SuperDraft, officially signing with the club in February 2019. He made 24 appearances (15 starts) in his first year with the Loons, scoring four goals, including a debut goal against Philadelphia (June 2). Dotson also made five appearances for Minnesota during its 2019 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup run, where it finished second to Atlanta United FC.

After totaling 47 more league appearances, three goals and four assists from 2020-2021, Dotson tore his ACL in April of 2022 and was out for the remainder of the season. Roaring back to form the following year, the midfielder appeared in 40 all-competition matches for Minnesota in 2023 and was the only player on the team to appear in all 34 league fixtures. Dotson then bagged five goals and tallied four assists in 29 games (26 starts) in league play in 2024 before injuries limited him to 12 MLS appearances in 2025, including four in postseason play as Minnesota advanced to the Western Conference Semifinals.

“Hassani is a player who understands the demands of this league and that’s important for us,” said Sounders FC Head Coach Brian Schmetzer. “He’s a smart soccer player, does the simple things well and gives you honest minutes in whatever role you ask of him. We think he can come in, do his job for this team and give us reliability in the middle of the field. I’m looking forward to seeing how he settles into our group.”

Prior to being drafted by the Loons, Dotson played for Seattle-area development teams Crossfire Academy and Washington Premier before a collegiate career at Oregon State University. He appeared in 72 games (68 starts) for the Beavers from 2015-2018, scoring five goals and adding three assists. He played every minute of his senior season, earning Second Team All-Pac-12 honors. Dotson also has five appearances at the U-23 level for the U.S. Men’s Youth National Team, scoring two goals.

JOÃO PAULO NEWEST DEFIANCE ASSISTANT

Tacoma Defiance announced on February 3 that former Sounders FC midfielder João Paulo was hired as an Assistant Coach following a six-year stint with the Rave Green, where he helped the club win the 2022 Concacaf Champions Cup and Leagues Cup 2025 titles. João Paulo joins the Defiance coaching staff after a 16-year playing career, including the last six with Sounders FC from 2020-2025. The Brazilian midfielder made 158 appearances in all competitions for Seattle, tallying eight goals and 27 assists, helping the club to the 2022 Concacaf Champions Cup and Leagues Cup 2025 titles, in addition to an MLS Cup Final appearance in 2020. In his second season with Seattle, he was named a finalist for the 2021 Landon Donovan Most Valuable Player Award following a three-goal, 11-assist season in the defensive midfield. This is his first coaching position since retiring as a player following the 2025 campaign.

SEATTLE HIRES RICARDO CLARK



Seattle Sounders FC announced on January 12 that it has hired Ricardo Clark as an Assistant Coach. Clark joins the club after serving five seasons within the Vancouver Whitecaps FC organization, most recently as Head Coach of Whitecaps FC 2 in MLS NEXT Pro from 2023-2025. As a player, Clark was one of the most accomplished MLS midfielders of his generation, compiling more than 400 appearances at the senior level across MLS and Europe, in addition to his time with United States Men’s National Team.

Clark, who holds his United States Soccer Federation (USSF) Pro License, was most recently hired as Head Coach for Whitecaps FC 2 on February 9, 2023, leading the team to the playoffs in both 2024 and 2025, and saw eight players signed to the First Team under his tenure. Prior to that, he was a First Team Assistant Coach for Vancouver Whitecaps FC from 2021-2022, serving under Head Coach Vanni Sartini, reaching the MLS Cup Playoffs in the 2021 campaign and winning the Canadian Championship in 2021. Clark also served as an Interim Head Coach for the Houston Dynamo’s U-19 Academy, Head Coach of the U-16 team and as an Assistant Coach with the United States U-20 Men’s National Team before joining Vancouver.

NAGAMURA NEW DEFIANCE SKIPPER



Tacoma Defiance announced on February 3 that it has hired Paulo Nagamura as its next Head Coach. Nagamura brings eight years of coaching expertise – notably serving as Head Coach of the Houston Dynamo in 2022 – and 12 years of playing experience in Major League Soccer, winning two MLS Cups and three Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cups as a player. Additionally, Defiance has hired former Sounders FC midfielder João Paulo as an Assistant Coach following a six-year stint with the Rave Green, where he helped the club win the 2022 Concacaf Champions Cup and Leagues Cup 2025 titles.

Nagamura, who has his USSF A and CONMEBOL B coaching licenses, most recently served as an Assistant Coach for Chicago Fire FC during the 2024 season. Prior to that, he was named Head Coach of Houston Dynamo FC at the beginning of the 2022 season, the youngest Head Coach in Houston’s history. He started his coaching career in 2017 with Sporting Kansas City II of the USL Championship, serving as Assistant Coach in 2017 and Head Coach from 2018-2021 before moving on to Houston.

Seattle Sounders FC on February 11 unveiled its 2026 Primary Kit, “The Evergreen State Kit,” a clean and elegant design that celebrates the spirit, color and culture that define Washington and the Sounders. Embracing simplicity and timelessness, the new kit pairs the club’s iconic Rave Green with subtle blue accents that mirror the state’s forests, waterways and coastline. Unveiled as Washington prepares to welcome the world for FIFA World Cup 2026™, the kit represents a continuation of Sounders FC and RAVE Foundation’s long-standing commitment to using soccer as a force for good across Washington, with design elements that intentionally spotlight impact beyond the pitch. “The Evergreen State Kit” is available beginning today at Sounders FC Pro Shop locations and online at [MLSStore.com](https://mlsstore.com).

Crafted with a lifestyle-forward approach, “The Evergreen State Kit” reflects Seattle’s heritage as a global soccer city and the deep connection between nature, community and the game. At the core of the design is a refined, premium aesthetic intended to resonate both on and off the pitch. Bespoke flat-knit patterns on the cuffs and collar add rich visual texture, while aqua accents ensure all three primary club colors are featured throughout the kit. Clean lines and a minimalist structure complete a look that is understated, versatile and distinctly Sounders.

Purpose is woven directly into the fabric of the jersey. On the front left hem, a custom jock tag reads “The Evergreen State,” a nod to Washington’s official nickname and the club’s identity as the Rave Green. On the outer back neck, an outline of the state of Washington is marked with 52 sparks, symbolizing Sounders FC’s legacy commitment through RAVE Foundation, the club’s official charitable arm, to build 52 free-to-play mini-pitches across the state by the end of 2026.

“These kits are an opportunity to tell a deeper story about who we are,” said Sounders FC President of Business Operations Hugh Weber. “The Evergreen State Kit reflects the beauty and simplicity of the world’s game, while grounding it in the values that define our club and our region. From the design details to the 52 sparks on the back neck, this jersey represents our commitment to community, access and opportunity. As part of the club’s Purpose Beyond the Pitch initiative, Sounders FC announced today that it will donate up to \$50,000 from the first 30 days of sales of “The Evergreen State Kit” to RAVE Foundation. RAVE Foundation believes that a free place to play can anchor a community and nurture a child. RAVE’s mission-driven work includes investing small fields for free play in underserved communities, and using soccer as a vehicle to inspire youth and strengthen communities.

“The Evergreen State Kit is a powerful expression of what RAVE Foundation believes at its core – that play is not a privilege,” said Sounders FC Chief Impact and Fan Engagement Officer Ashley Fosberg. “Every spark on this jersey represents not only a RAVE field, but the communities those fields inhabit. This kit helps shine a light on the impact happening across Washington and the legacy we’re building well beyond 2026.”

That commitment is shared by Sounders FC’s longstanding partners, including jersey sponsor Providence, whose support helps extend the club’s reach into communities throughout the region.

Produced in collaboration with adidas, “The Evergreen State Kit” is built for elite performance and world-class competition. The jersey features body-mapped, 3D engineered mechanical stretch fabrics incorporating adidas’ latest CLIMACOOL+ materials to wick sweat faster and keep players cooler and drier in high-pressure moments. Perforated three-stripe tapes and strategically placed mesh zones deliver best-in-class breathability and airflow, ensuring optimal comfort across varying conditions.





The kit also includes a lenticular, heat-applied Sounders FC crest and adidas logo, creating a unique shapeshifting visual effect that adds a modern, innovative finish to the classic design.

The launch campaign for “The Evergreen State Kit” features Seattle-based hip-hop artist Oblé Reed, whose story reflects the deeper meaning behind the jersey. A lifelong Sounders supporter who attended the club’s inaugural MLS match as a child, Reed found community and belief through the Sounders and the game of soccer. His journey embodies the right to play, belong and dream – values that sit at the heart of the club’s work across Washington.

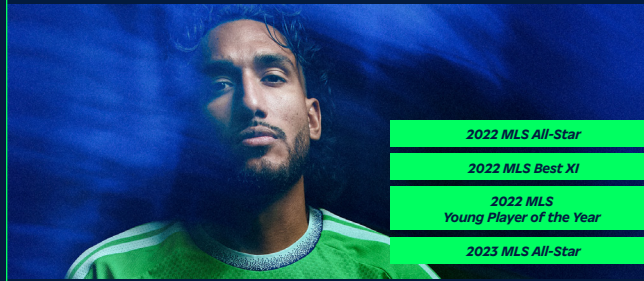

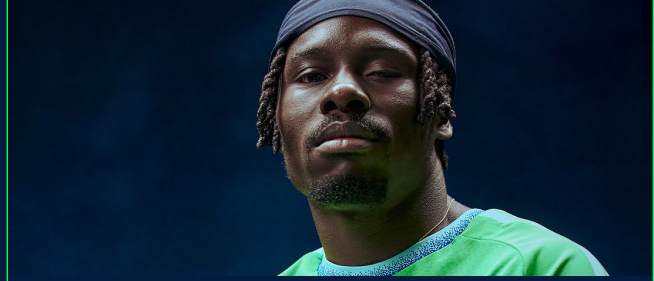
